<u>Chief Town Planner/Urban Design & Landscape, Planning Department's Detailed</u> <u>Comments on the application:</u>

Edge Landscape Treatment - Landscape Section A-A'

- (a) drainage should be provided at bottom of all slopes;
 - Edge Landscape Treatment Landscape Section B-B'
- (b) please provide elevation of the proposed stepped planter and indicate the choice of material preferably with cross-section;
- (c) some of the stepped planters, with over 6m level difference, are too massive. They should be broken down into terraces preferably not more than 4m in level difference;
- (d) as some planter walls will be over 6m in height, the applicant should seek advice from engineers regarding the width of these planter walls/retaining structures to ensure adequate planting space can be achieved for the proposed tree planting. The internal planter width of all proposed stepped planters should be indicated on a separate drawing in a readable scale;
- (e) the dimension of some planters does not tally with those shown on the LMP;
- (f) more cross sections (with largest level difference) along both the eastern and western boundary should be provided;
- (g) provision of safe maintenance access to these tall planters should be provided;
- (h) hand rails and adequate illumination should be provided along flight of steps;
- (i) adjoining site landform and context should be provided to demonstrate compatibility;
 - Landscape Master Plan Walking trail
- (j) finish level at 2m interval should be provided along the walking trail;
- (k) cross sections along the flight of steps should be provided to illustrate its side treatment with landscape proposal;
- (l) hand rails and illumination should be provided along the lengthy flight of steps leading to the trail and the entire trail;
- (m) the applicant should indicate whether it is a private access to the trail with lockage gate at the northern boundary;
 - Landscape Master Plan Multi-purpose lawn area
- (n) the applicant should indicate the access to this lawn area and also on the circulation diagram plan;
- (o) the applicant should indicate whether the multi-purpose lawn is flat or on a knoll/sunken area, and to amend the graphic if necessary to avoid confusion;

- Landscape Master Plan Boundary treatment
- (p) the applicant should indicate whether there will be a boundary fence/wall provided along the entire boundary. A more permeable boundary fence details should be adopted to interface with the surrounding natural setting;
- (q) it appears that an existing trail will be blocked by the tip of northern boundary. The applicant should clarify and to obtain prior agreement on realignment of trail;
 - *Landscape Master Plan Re-instatement planting (outside Site)*
- (r) a landscape proposal including re-instatement/compensatory tree planting should be provided for assessment. Agreement on such proposal should be sought from the relevant vegetation maintenance department(s) and such proposal should be provided in the application;

Open Space Provision

(s) calculation of open space provision should refer to HKPSG Chapter 4 "Recreation, Open Space and Greening". The applicant should note that the circulation space, such as flight of steps between the low-rise blocks, is not accountable for open space calculation and planting areas should be provided with benches. The applicant should review and amend as necessary;
