

I. Amendments to Matters shown on the Plan

- Item A1 – Rezoning of a piece of land along the waterfront to the west of Cadogan Street from “Undetermined” (“U”) to “Open Space (1)” (“O(1)”), and incorporation of four piers into the planning scheme area and zoning them to “O(1)”.
- Item A2 – Rezoning of an area between Sai Ning Street and Victoria Road from “U” and an area shown as ‘Road’ to “O”.
- Item A3 – Rezoning of an area along the waterfront to the north of Sai Ning Street from “U” to “O”.
- Item A4 – Rezoning of an area within the existing public open space adjoining The Sail at Victoria from “Other Specified Uses” annotated “Uses Related to Underground Refuse Transfer Station” (“OU(Uses Related to Underground Refuse Transfer Station)”) to “O”.
- Item B – Rezoning of an area currently occupied by godown and wharf facilities to the north of Sai Ning Street from “Industrial” (“I”) and “OU” annotated “Pier” (“OU(Pier)”) to “OU” annotated “Commercial, Leisure and Tourism Related Uses” (“OU(Commercial, Leisure and Tourism Related Uses)”) with stipulation of building height restrictions.
- Item C1 – Rezoning of an area to the south of Victoria Road and to the west of Ka Wai Man Road from “U”, “OU” annotated “Petrol Filling Station” (“OU(PFS)”), “Government, Institution or Community” (“G/IC”) and “Green Belt” (“GB”) to “Residential (Group A) 5” (“R(A)5”) with stipulation of building height restrictions.
- Item C2 – Rezoning of an area at the junction of Victoria Road and Cadogan Street from “U” and “O” to “R(A)6” with stipulation of building height restrictions.
- Item C3 – Rezoning of an area at the junction of Sai Ning Street and Victoria Road from “U” to “R(A)” with stipulation of building height restriction.
- Item C4 – Rezoning of an area between Sai Ning Street and Victoria Road to the west of a “Residential (Group E)” (“R(E)”) zone from “U” to “R(A)” with stipulation of building height restriction.
- Item D1 – Rezoning of an area to the east of Sai Ning Street from “U” to “G/IC” with stipulation of building height restriction.

- Item D2 – Rezoning of an area along the waterfront at the western end of Sai Ning Street from “U” and “OU(Uses Related to Underground Refuse Transfer Station)” to “G/IC” with stipulation of building height restriction.
- Item E – Rezoning of two areas at the western end of Victoria Road from “Residential (Group C)3” (“R(C)3”) to “OU” annotated “Public Mortuary” (“OU(Public Mortuary)”) with stipulation of building height restriction and from “GB” to “GB(2)” respectively.
- Item F – Rezoning of five strips of land along Cadogan Street, Victoria Road, Sai Ning Street and Ka Wai Man Road from “U”, “O”, “OU(PFS)” and “G/IC” to areas shown as ‘Road’.
- Item G – Excision of two sea areas at the waterfront to the further north of Sai Ning Street from the planning scheme area.
- Item H – Incorporation of an existing pier at New Praya, Kennedy Town into the planning scheme area, and zoning it to “OU(Pier)” with stipulation of building height restriction.
- Item J – Rezoning of four pieces of land between Victoria Road and the northern foothill of Mount Davis from “U” to “GB”.
- Item K – Rezoning of an existing MTR ventilation building to the further southwest of Ka Wai Man Road from “U” to “OU” annotated “MTR Ventilation Building” with stipulation of building height restriction.
- Item L – Rezoning of an area within the existing Underground Island West Refuse Transfer Station at the western end of Sai Ning Street from “U” to “OU(Uses Related to Underground Refuse Transfer Station)” with stipulation of building height restriction.
- Item M – Rezoning of an area to the south of Victoria Road for the existing Underground Island West Refuse Transfer Station from “U” to “GB(1)”.

II. Amendments to the Notes of the Plan

- (a) Revision to the covering Notes to delete the provision for the “U” zone.
- (b) Revision to the Schedule of Uses to incorporate provisions related to the “R(A)5” and “R(A)6” sub-zones and stipulation of the gross floor area restriction and the requirements regarding the provision of facilities in the Remarks of the Notes for the “R(A)” zone.
- (c) Revision to the planning intention of the “R(C)1” zone.
- (d) Revisions to the development restrictions exemption clause to clarify the provision related to caretaker’s quarters in the Remarks of the Notes for the “R(A)”, “Residential (Group B)”, “R(C)” and “R(C)1” zones.

- (e) Revision to the Schedule II of Uses for the "R(E)" zone to incorporate 'Art Studio (excluding those involving direct provision of services or goods)' as a Column 1 use and to correspondingly replace 'Place of Recreation, Sports or Culture' under Column 2 by 'Place of Recreation, Sports or Culture (not elsewhere specified)'.
- (f) Deletion of the Notes for the "I" zone.
- (g) Revisions to the Schedule of Uses to incorporate 'Pier (on land designated "O(1)" only)' as a Column 1 use and to correspondingly replace 'Pier' under Column 2 by 'Pier (not elsewhere specified)' and the planning intention for the "O" zone.
- (h) Incorporation of a new set of Notes for the "OU(Commercial, Leisure and Tourism Related Uses)" zone.
- (i) Revisions to the Schedule of Uses and the Remarks of the Notes for the "OU(Pier)" zone.
- (j) Incorporation of a new set of Notes for the "OU(Public Mortuary)" zone.
- (k) Revisions to the Schedule of Uses to incorporate "Underground Public Mortuary (on land designated "GB(2)" only)" and "Underground Refuse Transfer Station (on land designated "GB(1)" only)" as Column 1 uses and to correspondingly delete the Remarks of the Notes for the "GB" zone.
- (l) Other minor textual amendments.

**Planning Principles Adopted for
The Land Use Review on the Western Part of Kennedy Town**

The Land Use Review has taken into account the following planning principles:

Harbourfront Planning

- (a) to promote vibrancy, diversity and vitality by allowing variety of uses including waterfront promenade, open space, retail, dining, leisure, recreation, cultural and tourism-related uses at the harbourfront;
- (b) to improve accessibility of the waterfront area by providing continuous harbourfront promenade and linkage with the hinterland;
- (c) to create an interesting harbour image by encouraging diversity in building mass and varying BH to promote visual interest;
- (d) to maintain permeability to the harbour by providing wind/visual corridors;

Meeting Housing Needs

- (e) to meet housing needs by increasing housing land supply;

Phase Out Incompatible Uses

- (f) to phase out the existing incompatible industrial and godown uses at the harbourfront through providing redevelopment incentives;
- (g) to relocate incompatible Victoria Public Mortuary (VPM) and salt water pumping station to open up the harbourfront area for public enjoyment;

Provision of Open Space and Government, Institution and Community (GIC) Facilities

- (h) to increase the provision of open space and GIC facilities to meet local needs whenever possible;

Preservation

- (i) to preserve/ reprovise structure with historic interest at suitable location; and
- (j) to preserve Old and Valuable Trees (OVTs).

Ground Decontamination Work at the Sites of Ex-Kennedy Town Incineration
Plant/Abattoir and Adjoining Area

Background

The Government needs to carry out ground decontamination works at the ex-Kennedy Town Incineration Plant (KTIP) and ex-Kennedy Town Abattoir (KTA) and adjoining area (the Site), with a total area of 3.2 hectares, before it is developed for other uses.

2. The scope of the ground decontamination works comprises:-
 - (a) removal of remaining disused structures within the ex-KTIP and ex-KTA sites as well as other structures at the temporary refuse collection point (RCP), the temporary public car park, the Cadogan Street Temporary Garden (CSTG) and Sai See Street within the Site;
 - (b) carrying out ground decontamination works; and
 - (c) in-situ reprovisioning of a temporary public car park and a temporary RCP within the Site¹.
3. A site plan showing the boundary of the proposed works and the locations of the reprovisioned facilities are at **Enclosures 1 and 2** respectively.
4. The KTIP ceased to operate in 1993 and the KTA was closed in 1999. The Government decided in 1999 to re-develop the Site and the Civil Engineering and Development Department (CEDD) was commissioned to undertake the decommissioning of these facilities and the associated ground decontamination works. The project is a designated project under Schedule 2 to the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Ordinance (Cap. 499) and an Environmental Permit (EP) is required for the project. The EIA report on the project and the supplementary EIA on the ground decontamination works were approved by the Director of Environmental Protection (DEP) in April 2002 and April 2015 respectively.

¹ If on-site reprovisioning of the CSTG together with RCP and public car park is required before their demolition or removal, the decontamination works will take at least 13 years to complete. In view of the substantially longer construction period which will increase the nuisance to the public, on-site reprovisioning of CSTG during decontamination was not recommended. The recommended 7-year implementation option with on-site reprovisioning of the RCP and public car park was supported by the Central & Western District Council in March 2015.

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**Ground Decontamination Work at the Sites of Ex-Kennedy Town Incineration
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5. The EIA reports and the site investigation indicate that the underground soil within the Site, which includes the CSTG, has been contaminated with heavy metals and hydrocarbons which have exceeded the relevant standards. Decontamination works for the underground soil at the Site are therefore required. The aforementioned two EIA reports² concluded that the environmental impact of the decontamination project can be controlled to within the criteria under the EIA Ordinance and the Technical Memorandum on EIA Process.
6. The Government originally planned to commence the ground decontamination works immediately after completion of the demolition works within the ex-KTIP and ex-KTA sites. However, it was subsequently decided in December 2006 that the ex-KTIP and ex-KTA sites would be used as a temporary works area for the construction of the West Island Line (WIL) after completion of the demolition works in 2009. The demolition works were completed in 2009 and the ex-KTIP and ex-KTA sites were then handed over to MTR Corporation Limited and Highways Department (HyD) for the provision of WIL works area and a maintenance depot respectively. As a result, the ground decontamination works (the remaining part of the decommissioning project under the EIA Ordinance) have not commenced yet. The MTRC subsequently returned the WIL works area to the Government in January 2016. HyD has also removed the maintenance depot and temporarily retained the site as its storage area before commencement of the proposed works. Therefore, the Government plans to commence the proposed works as early as practicable.
7. To eliminate the health risks posed by contaminated soil and prepare the Site for future development for optimal land utilization, the Government's decontamination works will cover all areas of the Site as a whole, including the CSTG given the proximity of the Site within a dense urban area. According to the findings of the approved EIA reports, the underground soil within the Site (including CSTG) contains contaminants which have exceeded the relevant standards. Hence, it is imperative to eliminate any potential risk caused by the contamination, improve the

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local environment and pave way for long term development in the area.

Public Consultation

8. During the process, the Government has consulted the Central & Western District Council (C&WDC) on the proposed decontamination works several times. In July 2006, the Food, Environment, Hygiene and Works Committee (FEHWC) of the Central and Western District Council (C&WDC) passed a motion strongly demanding the Government to carry out both the demolition works and the ground decontamination works in one-go. The decontamination works was also supported in the C&WDC meeting in March 2015. Recently, a few C&W DC Members expressed concern over the demolition of the existing CSTG for the proposed works and the planned private housing development thereat. In response to the above concern, the Government attended the meeting of FEHWC of C&W DC in October 2016 to explain in detail the need of the proposed works at the Site (including the CSTG) to remove any potential risk due to the contamination and prepare the Site for future development.

9. Apart from the C&WDC, the Government has also met, informed and consulted other relevant stakeholders on the ground decontamination works several times to understand their concern and explain the objective and need of the ground decontamination works. The details of such meetings/consultations are tabulated below:-

Environmental Impact Assessment

Site Investigation

10. To assess the condition of the ground contamination, a total of 189 site investigation (SI) boreholes (including 18 SI boreholes at CSTG) were carried out at the Site by CEDD in 2000 and 2003 as sampling points to identify the type, extent and concentration of contaminants in the underground soil. The number of the sampling points has exceeded the minimum requirement specified in "Practice Guide for Investigation and Remediation of Contaminated Land" published by the Environmental Protection Department (EPD) and is adequate to ascertain the overall condition of the contaminants in the underground soil.

11. Subsequently, 4 additional SI boreholes were carried out by CEDD within the bus depot area in 2013 in order to assess the potential additional contamination caused by the continued operation of the ex-bus depot of New World First Bus after 2003. The results of these 4 boreholes indicated the presence of heavy metals and hydrocarbons with concentrations in exceedance of the threshold values. The additional SI carried out in 2013 did not show that the contaminants within the Site have reduced in amount. Rather, these results confirmed the existence of the contaminants exceeding the relevant standards and ground decontamination works are required.

Key Findings

12. The results of the EIA and the site investigation indicated that the underground soil within the Site (including CSTG) has been contaminated by heavy metals (including lead, arsenic, mercury, etc.) and hydrocarbons (including Benzo(a)pyrene, Benzo(b)fluoranthene, etc.) which have exceeded the standards specified in the "Guidance Manual for Use of Risk-Based Remediation Goals for Contaminated Land Management"³ issued by EPD. The total volume of

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contaminated soil is about 110,000 cubic metres (including about 20,000 cubic metres at CSTG) and the contaminants are located at various depths down to maximum 12 metres at the Site (maximum 9 metres at CSTG).

Decontamination Methods

13. CEDD's Consultants have considered the feasibility of various decontamination methods previously adopted in Hong Kong and overseas. Taking into account various factors such as the types of contaminants, the volume of soil to be treated, the impact of works to the nearby environment, cost and whether the technique adopted in the decontamination methods is well established, it is concluded that the proposed decontamination methods (i.e. cement solidification and biopiling) are practical and viable. The method of cement solidification involves the addition of cement and water to limit the mobility of the heavy metals, whereas the method of biopiling involves heaping contaminated soil into piles (or biopiles) and stimulating aerobic microbial activity within the soil to break down the hydrocarbons by biodegradation through aeration. The proposed decontamination methods have been adopted in Hong Kong and overseas for many years and are considered effective for implementation.

14. During the decontamination works, the contractor will dig up, sort and treat the soil on-site, and then use the treated soil after testing to backfill the excavations.

15. To maintain the services of the temporary public car park and RCP to the public throughout the decontamination period, the sites will be cleaned up in sequence to allow their in-situ reprovisioning during the decontamination.

16. As for the alternative decontamination method by plants/trees as suggested by some members of public, the Consultants suggested that the roots with absorption ability of the contaminants in general could only reach shallow depths (less than 1 m). As the contaminated soil is scattered over the Site with a maximum depth of 12 m (9 m at CSTG) below ground and the volume of contaminated soil is about 110,000 m³ (about 20,000 m³ at CSTG), the above technique is unsuitable for this ground decontamination works project. The Consultants also advised that this method has not been used locally and most of the overseas cases are still at a continuing trial stage; thus the effectiveness of this method has yet to be verified.

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**Ground Decontamination Work at the Sites of Ex-Kennedy Town Incineration
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Impact on Trees

17. The Consultants arranged a tree expert to carry out several inspections of the trees within the Site in order to identify the number of trees affected by the decontamination works as well as their species and conditions. None of the affected trees is listed in the Register of Old and Valuable Trees. Based on the results of the inspections, the Consultants completed the impact assessment of the project works on the trees and formulated a compensation proposal.

18. During the assessment of impact on the trees arising from the project, the Consultants also considered the feasibility of retaining or transplanting the trees in the first instance. However, on-site tree preservation is considered impracticable because it necessitates on-site retention of contaminated soil around the tree roots (which contains heavy metals and hydrocarbons), hinders the decontamination works and also defeats the purpose of the decontamination works. As for the feasibility of tree transplantation, the Consultants consider that this arrangement would transfer the contaminated soil within the tree rootball to the soil at the recipient locations, thereby contaminating the recipient site. Thus, it is impracticable as well. Decontamination of the tree rootball by “washing off” the contaminated soil before transplanting the trees to their recipient locations is also considered impracticable as such operation will damage the roots and lower the survival rate of the trees substantially.

19. Based on the above assessment and recommendation, the 195 trees within the Site are proposed to be removed, including three individuals of *Aquilaria sinensis* and two individuals of *Ailanthus fordii*, which are of precious or rare species. Since these two concerned species are commonly cultivated in Hong Kong, the use of these two species for compensatory tree planting is therefore practicable and will be duly considered when formulating the detailed compensatory tree planting plan (planting of about 195 trees).

Impact on Ecology

20. According to the EIA report, CSTG does not have a high ecological value as it is a wholly artificial habitat which is not supporting any significant population of wild fauna or species of conservation importance. Despite the above, precautionary measures will be implemented during the decontamination works. Site inspection to identify whether there are any active bird nests and bat roosts will be carried out prior

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to site clearance works. If any bird nest or bat roost is observed, appropriate measures, e.g. setting up a suitably sized buffer area around the tree to minimize human or machinery disturbance until the nest has been abandoned or the bat has left, will be implemented.

Environmental Mitigation Measures

21. The EIA reports have assessed the impact of the decontamination project on air quality, health, noise and water quality. Based on the results of the assessment, CEDD will implement the required environmental mitigation measures in accordance with the approved EIA reports and the respective Environmental Permit conditions granted under the EIA Ordinance to ensure that the environmental impact of the project can be controlled to within the relevant criteria.

22. The key measures during the ground decontamination works include: control on total active excavation area to about 10% of the area of the Site at any one time in order to minimize dust generation and release of contaminants during excavation; installation of activated carbon filters in the outlet of biopile for removing volatile organic compound emissions during biopile operation; adoption of quieter equipment, movable noise barriers and noise insulating fabric to minimise construction noise impact; control of site surface water run-off from the project site; adoption of good site practices for construction dust control. To further minimize the potential environmental impact, we will also adopt additional mitigation measures including installation of temporary movable barriers and temporary movable canopies at excavation areas and temporary soil stockpiling areas respectively to shield dust and noise and enhance visual impact.


Environmental Monitoring and Audit Programme

23. CEDD will carry out an environmental monitoring and audit programme in accordance with the approved EIA report and relevant EP conditions granted under the EIA Ordinance. Among other things, CEDD will carry out air quality monitoring regularly to measure the concentration of the ambient total suspended particulates at nearby residential developments as well as the concentration of the ambient hydrocarbons at the site boundary and at the discharge vents of the biopiles during the decontamination works. The results of the environmental monitoring will be made available for public inspection. Works liaison group will also be set up by CEDD in the course of works to strengthen community liaison.





Item 7 Any Other Business

A. Presentation from the Protect Cadogan Park Alliance

- 7.1 **The Chair** welcomed representatives from the Protect Cadogan Park Alliance (the Alliance) to the meeting. **Mr Ben MOK** presented the Alliance's views on retaining the Cadogan Street Temporary Garden (the Park) with the aid of a PowerPoint.
- 7.2 **Mr Ken SO** requested CEDD to fully justify the need for carrying out decontamination works at the site concerned in the western part of Kennedy Town.
- 7.3 **Mr LEUNG Kong-yiu** commented that the Park was open to the public for 18 years. Even if there were contaminants underneath the Park, they had not posed any threat to the health of people. Besides, the Park could help enhance accessibility to the future waterfront. He said the Government could identify another site for residential development.
- 7.4 **Mr Raymond CHAN** echoed that the Government should identify other suitable sites for residential development and retain the Park. He added that land use planning should be examined holistically.
- 7.5 **Mr Anthony CHEUNG** commented that the Park, which could enhance connection between the hinterland and the waterfront, should be kept. The Government could review the land use proposal and identify other means such as increasing building height restriction over the territory to increase housing production.
- 7.6 **Mr Ivan HO** said relevant Government departments should consult the local community again and retain the Park as far as practicable.
- 7.7 **Mr Paul ZIMMERMAN** commented that the Alliance had presented some compelling arguments. According to the Alliance's investigation, the contamination was deep underground and had not affected public health in all these years. Users of the Park, including the elderly and the kids,

were allowed to gain access to the Park for years. He did not see sufficient justification to close the Park for carrying out decontamination works.

7.8 **The Chair** said the Task Force shared the view of the Alliance to retain the Park. The Task Force's view would be conveyed to the TPB as usual.

7.9 **Mr Louis KAU** made the following responses-

- (a) the content of the Alliance's presentation, was similar to that of their representation made under the Town Planning Ordinance, which would be considered by the TPB;
- (b) a hearing on representations and comments in respect of the amendments to the draft Kennedy Town and Mount Davis Outline Zoning Plan (OZP) would be held in Q1 of 2017 to further listen to oral submissions made by the representers and commenters; and
- (c) the amendments to the draft OZP were drawn up taking into account the need for the decontamination works as identified by relevant department and for the public to enjoy larger public open space at the waterfront.

7.10 **Mr Ben MOK** thanked the Task Force for their support for retaining the Park and asked PlanD to review the amendments to the OZP.

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

Building Gaps

- 7.12 According to the AVA EE 2013, **three four** building gaps are recommended. A north-west to south-easterly building gap of 15m wide above podium of the “R(A)6” zone is required. In addition, two north-west to south-easterly building gaps of 15m wide above podium of the “R(A)5” zone are required **and a building gap of 15m wide above 20mPD (about 15m above ground level) is imposed on the land portion of the “OU” annotated “Commercial, Leisure and Tourism Related Uses” zone to the north of Sai Ning Street.** They are to mitigate the wind wake due to the proposed developments and to facilitate katabatic air movement from the vegetated hill slope to the waterfront and sea breezes from the north.

Non-building Areas

- 7.13 According to the AVA EE 2013, ~~two NBA~~ **an NBA** is recommended. ~~In order to allow higher permeability at the waterfront and along the major north-south ventilation corridor, and to take forward the recommendation of the AVA, a 30m wide north-west to south-easterly NBA is designated at the land portion of the “OU” annotated “Commercial, Leisure and Tourism Related Uses” zone to the north of Sai Ning Street to facilitate katabatic air movement to the waterfront and sea breezes from the north.~~ In order to facilitate south-westerly wind on ground level, a north-east to south-westerly NBA of 15m wide on ground level is designated to the west of Ka Wai Man Road. Within the NBAs, no above ground structure is allowed except for minor structures with high air porosity, such as covered walkway and elevated footbridge. Below ground structure is allowed within the NBAs.

- 8.8 Other Specified Uses (“OU”): Total Area 8.91 hectares

8.8.3 A site at Sai Ning Street and its associated pier are zoned “OU” annotated “Commercial, Leisure and Tourism Related Uses” to facilitate the long-term development of a vibrant waterfront area. Development/redevelopment within this zone is restricted to a maximum GFA of ~~46,446m²~~ **65,146m²** and a maximum building height of 70mPD for the land portion and 2 storeys for the pier portion. ~~A 12-metre wide waterfront promenade~~ **An elevated or at grade or multi-level waterfront promenade with a total width of 6m** linking up the open spaces on both ends shall be provided to allow promenade continuity and public enjoyment. In addition, a ~~NBA~~ **building gap** is proposed as detailed in paragraph ~~7.13~~ **7.12** above to facilitate air ventilation. The waterfront promenade and ~~NBA~~ **building gap** should be incorporated in the lease condition to effect implementation.

Amendment Proposed

Remarks

- (1) No new development, or addition, alteration and/or modification to or redevelopment of an existing building shall result in a total development and/or redevelopment in excess of a maximum GFA of ~~46,116~~ **65,100m²**, and the maximum building heights, in terms of metres above Principal Datum and number of storeys, as stipulated on the Plan, or the GFA and height of the existing building, whichever is the greater. ~~A 12-metre wide waterfront promenade~~ **An elevated or at grade or multi-level waterfront promenade with a total width of 6m** linking up the open spaces on both sides should be provided for public use. **A 15-metre wide building gap from 20 metres above Principal Datum should be provided and the disposition of the building gap should be similar to the gap between the two existing buildings.**

- (2) Based on the individual merits of a development or redevelopment proposal, minor relaxation of the building height ~~and~~, GFA **and building gap** restrictions, and the width of the waterfront promenade stated in paragraph (1) above may be considered by the Town Planning Board on application under section 16 of the Town Planning Ordinance.



PEDESTRIAN FLOW 人流分析




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



The Representation Sites and Their Respective Surrounding Areas

(Plans, aerial photos and site photos at Plans H-5 to H-62)

A brief account of the representation sites is as follows:

Waterfront Park and Open Space

1. Amendment Item A1 – Proposed Waterfront Park

1.1 The site is a large stretch of government land (about 1.66ha) fronting the harbour and located to the west of Cadogan Street. It is currently occupied by the salt water pumping station, the Victoria Public Mortuary (VPM) and the temporary maintenance depot of Highways Department (HyD) which have rendered the waterfront inaccessible to the public. The site also falls within the project boundary of the ground decontamination works to be conducted by the Civil Engineering and Development Department (CEDD) (the temporary works site is temporary granted to CEDD until 31.1.2023).

1.2 There are also four unused piers within the site. Two of the piers to the west were used to serve Kennedy Town Incinerator and Abattoir in the past. The remaining two were for loading/unloading activities in the area.

2. Amendment Item A2 – Proposed Open Space between Victoria Road and Sai Ning Street

The site currently falls within a part of the existing bus terminus on Sai Ning Street and a part of the existing Kennedy Town Bus Terminus Sitting-out Area on government land (0.08ha). There are two Old and Valuable Trees (OVTs) in the

Kennedy Town Bus Terminus Sitting-out Area.

3. Amendment Item A3 – Kennedy Town Temporary Recreation Ground

The site occupies a major portion of the existing Kennedy Town Temporary Recreation Ground on government land (0.57ha) in the western end of Sai Ning Street and is now under the management of the Leisure and Cultural Services Department (LCSD).

Commercial, Leisure and Tourism Related Uses at the Waterfront

4. Amendment Item B – Proposed Commercial, Leisure and Tourism Related Uses

The China Merchants Group (CMG)'s godowns and wharf together with its pier at 18 Sai Ning Street (about 1.35ha) are held under Inland Lot (IL) No. 8623, which was granted by way of private treaty grant for godown and cargo handling pier for a term of 75 years from 21.5.1985. According to the lease condition, the land portion is subject to a maximum GFA not exceeding 46,445.42m². It is now occupied by two existing godown buildings with a total GFA of about 46,323m². The building heights (BHs) of the two existing godown buildings are about 64mPD (west) and 84mPD (east).

Residential Developments

5. Amendment Item C1 – Proposed Public Housing Development

The site at the hillside of Mount Davis to the south of Victoria Road, comprising the Ex-Temporary School Site for the Hong Kong Academy, the Ex-Police Married Officers Quarters at Ka Wai Man Road and the Ex-Mount Davis Cottage Area (about 2.88 ha), is entirely government land. The access to the site will be via Ka Wai Man Road and Victoria Road. The surrounding developments are primarily high-rise residential in nature (**Plan H-71**).

6. Amendment Item C2 – Proposed Private Residential Development

The site (0.91 ha) at junction of Victoria Road/Cadogan Street is a piece of government land and is currently occupied by the Cadogan Street Temporary Garden, a temporary car park and a refuse collection point (RCP). The site also falls with the project boundary of ground decontamination works to be conducted by CEDD (the temporary works site is temporary granted to CEDD until 31.1.2023). Its surrounding developments are primarily high-rise residential in nature (**Plan H-71**).

7. Amendment Item C3 – Proposed Private Residential Development

The site (0.23 ha) at junction of Victoria Road/Sai Ning Street is a piece of government land occupied mainly by the bus terminus at Sai Ning Street, a public toilet and part of the Kennedy Town Bus Terminus sitting-out area. The existing arch and foundation stone of the Tung Wah Smallpox Hospital are located within the site in the sitting-out area. Its surrounding developments are primarily high-rise residential in nature.

8. Amendment Item C4 - Proposed Private Residential Development

The site (0.05ha) between Victoria Road and Sai Ning Street is a piece of government land and is occupied by the Food and Environmental Hygiene Department (FEHD)'s temporary cleansing depot and HyD's works area under road maintenance contract.

GIC Facilities

9. Amendment Item D1 – Proposed Primary School

9.1 The site (0.62ha) is located at the junction of Sai Ning Street and Victoria Road. There are currently part of a temporary car park, part of the temporary maintenance depot for HyD and part of the VPM on this piece of government land. It also forms part of the temporary works site of CEDD for ground decontamination works (the temporary works site is temporary granted to CEDD

until 31.1.2023).

9.2 Being next to the proposed waterfront park, the site will form a cluster of low-rise facilities including Kennedy Town Jockey Club Clinic and HKSKH St Luke's Church Pastoral Centre on the other side of Victoria Road, thus retaining the visual openness and permeability of the local area.

10. Amendment Item D2 – Proposed Salt Water Pumping Station

The site on government land (0.09ha) is currently a sitting-out area at the western end of the Kennedy Town Temporary Recreation Ground and to the east of the Island West Refuse Transfer Station.

11. Amendment Item E – Proposed Re-provisioning of VPM

The site is located to the further west of Victoria Road away from the existing residential neighbourhood. It consists of two parcels of government land. The eastern portion (0.56 ha) is an existing cavern (in a form of tunnel) and was used by MTRC as a magazine site for the construction of West Island Line. The western portion (0.29 ha) is currently used by HyD as temporary works areas under Temporary Government Land Allocation.

Road and Junction Improvements

12. Amendment Item F – Road and Junction Improvements and Reflect Existing Road Alignment

The site (0.7ha) for road and junction improvement works and reflecting existing road alignment falls mainly on government land with a minor portion falls within the Inland Lot 9029 for petrol filling station granted for a term up to 2032. The site locates along Victoria Road, Sai Ning Street, Ka Wai Man Road and Cadogan Street and a part of it will form a new road to connect Cadogan Street and Victoria Road.

13. Amendment Item G – Excision of Planning Scheme Areas

Two sea areas (with site areas of about 645m² and 353m² in the eastern and western portion respectively) fronting the waterfront in the western part of Kennedy Town are excised from the planning scheme area.

14. Amendment Item H – Pier

An existing pier (about 0.004ha) on government land is located at the junction of the New Praya, Kennedy Town and Davis Street and currently managed by the Government Property Agency. The pier is currently closed. It was mainly to provide facilities for loading/unloading activities along the coastal area of Kennedy Town.

15. Amendment Item J – Green Belt

The sites involved are all government land.

16. Amendment Item K – Existing Vent Shaft

An existing vent shaft for the WIL (about 0.02 ha) is located to the southwest of Ka Wai Man Road to the south of the proposed public housing site (Amendment Item C1). It falls within the Mass Transit Railway Lot No. MTRL 4 RLL..

17. Amendment Item A4 – Area to Reflect Existing Open Space

The site (about 0.01ha) is part of the public open space provided by the private residential development i.e. The Sail at Victoria. The said public open space, including the site, is a piece of government land.

18. Amendment Item L – Area to Reflect Boundary of the Island West Refuse Transfer Station (Above Ground Portion)

The site (about 0.02 ha) is located to the west of the Kennedy Town Temporary Recreation Ground and to the western end of Sai Ning Street. It falls within the

Island West Refuse Transfer Station of the Environmental Protection Department (EPD) and is allocated to EPD.

19. *Amendment Item M – Area to Reflect Boundary of the Island West Refuse Transfer Station (Underground Portion)*

The site (about 0.33 ha) is located to the south of the Island West Refuse Transfer Station of EPD and Victoria Road. It forms part of the existing underground Island West Refuse Transfer Station and is allocated to EPD.

1. Introduction

- 1.1 In order to enhance the land uses in the Western District and to grasp the opportunity of the commissioning of the MTR West Island Line, the Planning Department (PlanD) has undertaken the Land Use Review on the Western Part of Kennedy Town (the Land Use Review). The review area is shown in **Plan 1 of Appendix A**.
- 1.2 A Preliminary Land Use Proposal (the Preliminary Proposal) for the Western Part of Kennedy Town was developed in 2013 by PlanD. A traffic review for the Preliminary Proposal was conducted and roads / junctions improvement schemes recommended. In mid-2013, PlanD consulted the Central and Western District Council (C&WDC) and the Harbourfront Commission, and attended two public forums organised by local District Council members to solicit views of the stakeholders on the Preliminary Proposal. After taking into account the views of different parties, PlanD revised the Preliminary Proposal and developed a Revised Land Use Proposal (the RLUP) (**Plan 2 of Appendix A**) in September 2014, which mainly involved reduction of the total number of public housing units and revision of the road layout.
- 1.3 The C&WDC was concerned about the shortage of parking spaces for cars and goods vehicles in the Western District. As some short term tenancy sites currently providing goods vehicles parking spaces in the Central & Western District will be terminated for other development in the coming years, shortage of goods vehicle parking spaces is anticipated. Besides, there is great demand for private car parking spaces in Kennedy Town. To cope with the parking demand, an underground carpark for private cars and goods vehicles dedicated for public use is included in the RLUP.
- 1.4 Because of the changes made under the RLUP, the roads and junctions improvement schemes identified in the traffic review are further assessed to ascertain their effectiveness.

2. Proposed traffic improvement measures

- 2.1 To cater for the RLUP, the following road improvement schemes are proposed and they are shown in **Appendix B**:
 - (i) Construction of a new access road to connect Victoria Road and Cadogan Street for diversion of Central-bound traffic;

- (ii) Following (i) above, closing the eastbound lane of Victoria Road at the junction of Victoria Road / Belcher's Street / Cadogan Street junction (J4) to enhance the junction performance;
- (iii) Following (ii) above, prohibition of right turning movement from Ka Wai Man Road to Victoria Road (J29);
- (iv) Widening of a section of Victoria Road between Cadogan Street and the access road to the Environmental Protection Department's Island West Refuse Transfer Station to cope with the anticipated traffic;
- (v) Signalization of the new access road / Catchick Street / Cadogan Street junction (J4A);
- (vi) Signalization of Victoria Road / Sai Ning Street junction (J28); and
- (vii) Signalization of Victoria Road / new access road junction (J32).

2.3 With the implementation of the above improvement works, the performance of the key junctions within the RLUP and in the vicinity as shown in **Appendix B** are acceptable in 2027 (3 years after the planned completion of the RLUP). The results of junction capacity assessment are summarized in **Table 1**.

Remarks: In general, the performance of the junction is considered satisfactory if the RC of signalized junction is greater than 15%, or DFC of priority junction is less than 0.85 during peak periods.

2.4 The assessment also indicates that the performance of the existing junctions J4, J28 and J29 will operate satisfactorily in 2024 after the population intake of the public housing development at Site 9. Nevertheless, interim traffic improvement measures including removing the western arm of pedestrian crossing at Belcher's Street/Sands Street junction, signaling adjustment at the junction of J4 and widening of a section of Ka Wai Man Road for provision of a new layby would be implemented to further enhance the road capacity before the population intake of the public housing development.

3. Pedestrian facilities assessment

3.1 The Level-of-Services (LOS) of the footpaths of Ka Wai Man Road were assessed and the results are summarized in Table 2. The footpaths F1 and F2 of Ka Wai Man Road as shown in Appendix B in 2027 will achieve at least LOS B, therefore the walking environment of Ka Wai Man Road after the population intake of the public housing development will remain satisfactory.

In general, LOS C or above is desirable for most design at streets with dominant pedestrian activities.

4. Internal transport provision of the development sites

- 4.1 The internal parking and loading / unloading facilities of the development sites should be self-contained and be provided within the site in accordance with the prevailing standards.
- 4.2 To address the public parking demand in the Central & Western District, about 50 goods vehicles and 70 private car parking spaces dedicated for public use will be provided at the underground carpark at Site 3a. The Housing Authority will also provide 25 public parking spaces for light goods vehicles within Phase 2 of the public housing development at Site 9.

5. Pedestrian facilities

- 5.1 To provide a safe, direct and comfort route for pedestrians walking between Victoria Road and the future waterfront promenade, the following pedestrian facilities which are shown in **Appendix C** will be provided:
 - (i) The Victoria Road / Sai Ning Street junction and Victoria Road / new access road junction will be signalized and pedestrian crossings will be provided at these two junctions.
 - (ii) Two footbridges across Victoria Road and a new pedestrian crossing at Sai Ning Street will be provided to serve a safe and direct connection between the public housing site and the open space at the waterfront area and new bus terminus. These two tentative footbridges can also facilitate the private housing sites to gain access to the social welfare facilities located within the public housing site. The location of landing / connection points including the disabled lifts of the footbridges are subject to detailed design.
 - (iii) The western pavement of Cadogan Street between Victoria Road and new access road will be widened to 7m to improve the accessibility to / from the open space at the waterfront area from the inland side.
 - (iv) A footbridge between the private residential development cum new bus terminus and the waterfront promenade across the proposed new access road.
- 5.2 As shown in **Appendix C**, with the above pedestrian facilities, three major pedestrian corridors leading from the inland side to the open space at the waterfront area will be provided, i.e. along the western footpath of Cadogan Street; along the footpaths of


both sides of the new access road; and along the eastern pavement of Sai Ning Street.

6. Public transport facilities

- 6.1 A new bus terminus will be provided at the ground floor of Site 3a to accommodate the bus routes which are currently allocated in the existing Kennedy Town bus terminus at Sai Ning Street and the Belcher's Bay bus terminus.
- 6.2 In addition, a new bus layby will be provided on westbound Victoria Road for the public housing site, as shown in **Appendix B**.

7. Conclusion

- 7.1 The traffic improvement schemes previously proposed for the Preliminary Proposal remain valid in the RLUP.
- 7.2 With the implementation of the proposed traffic improvement measures, the traffic impact arising from the RLUP in 2027 will be acceptable.
- 7.3 The traffic situation in the vicinity will be satisfactory after the population intake of the public housing development in 2024, and road capacity will be further enhanced by the interim traffic improvement measures before the completion of the public housing development.
- 7.4 The walking environment of Ka Wai Man Road footpaths is acceptable in 2027.




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

Supplementary Information to the “Traffic Review for the Land Use Proposal on the Western Part of Kennedy Town” (the Traffic Review) (Appendix II of Attachment V of the MPC Paper No. 1/16 refers) provided in April to June 2016 upon the receipt of a request from a member of the public

1) Supplement to paragraphs 2.3 and 3.1 (Assumptions and methodology)

- Traffic surveys were conducted in 2015 to collect existing vehicular and pedestrian flow data. As mentioned in Para. 2.3 of the Traffic Review, the design year adopted for the assessment was 2027. An interim year (2024) was also selected to review the need of any interim traffic improvement measures upon completion of the public housing site. To work out the traffic forecast for the design year and the interim year, a set of growth factors (+3.81% for years from 2015 to 2016, 0% for years from 2016 to 2021, +1.88% for years from 2021 to 2026, +0.34% for years from 2026 to 2031) was used with reference to the historical traffic data of Annual Traffic Census (from 2010 to 2014) published by the Transport Department and the planning data for the latest enhanced 2011-based Territorial Population and Employment Data Matrices published by the Planning Department.
- The vehicular and pedestrian trips induced by the new developments of the western part of Kennedy Town were also taken into account in the traffic forecast. The vehicular generation and attraction were estimated with reference to the trip generation and attraction rates in Tables 1 & 2 of the Appendix in Chapter 3 of Volume 1 of Transport Planning Design Manual published by the Transport Department. To estimate the pedestrian generation and attraction, two assumptions, i.e. 90% of the total population of the public housing development would make 2 trips per day, and the morning, afternoon and evening peak hours would account for 12%, 5% and 12% of the daily trip total respectively, were made based on the results of the Travel Characteristic Survey 2011.

2) Supplement to paragraph 2.3 (Methodology of junction capacity assessment)

Methodology

- Priority Junction - J28 (2015, 2024 and 2027 without improvement) and J29
 - The calculation is based on a set of empirical formulae/equations, which are shown in Annex A. In general, the parameters of junction geometry which have been found to exert the major influence on capacity of non priority movements are: major road width, width of central median, lane width available to waiting traffic streams and visibility distances for non priority

traffic streams. These parameters are employed in the equations.

- In evaluation, the design flow should be compared with the calculated capacity to produce a design flow/capacity ratio (DFC) for each non priority movement.
 - The methodology of traffic forecast was explained in 1) above.
 - In general, the performance of the junction is considered satisfactory if DFC of the priority junction is less than 0.85 during peak periods.
- Signalised Junction – J4, J4A, J28 (2027 with improvement) and J32
 - The concept and a set of equations for signal calculations are described and shown in Annex B.
 - The methodology of traffic forecast was explained in 1) above.
 - In general, the performance of the junction is considered satisfactory if Reserve Capacity of the signalized junction is greater than 15% during peak periods.

Supplement to paragraph 3.1 (Methodology of pedestrian facilities assessment)

- The methodology of estimation of pedestrian flow in 2027 was explained in 1) above.
- The Level-of-Services (LOS) is obtained by dividing the two-way pedestrian flow (i.e. 2-way ped/min) by the effective width of the footpath concerned.
- According to the Highway Capacity Manual (HCM-version 2000), the LOS is primarily based on the density of people in a given space. There are six levels. In general, LOS C is desirable for most design at streets with dominant “living” pedestrian activities. Extracted details of the HCM LOS are tabulated below.

**Description of Level-of-Service (LOS)
(Reference: HCM 2000)**

LOS	Flow Rate (ped/min/m)	Description
A	≤ 16	Pedestrians basically move in desired paths without altering their movements in response to other pedestrians. Walking speeds are freely selected, and conflicts between pedestrians are unlikely.
B	16 - 23	Sufficient space is provided for pedestrians to freely select their walking speeds, to bypass other pedestrians and to avoid crossing conflicts with others. At this level, pedestrians begin to be aware of other pedestrians and to respond to their presence in the selection of walking paths.
C	23 - 33	Sufficient space is available to select normal walking speeds and to bypass other pedestrians primarily in unidirectional stream. Where reverse direction or crossing movement exist, minor conflicts will occur, and speed and volume will be somewhat lower.
D	33 - 49	Freedom to select individual walking speeds and bypass other pedestrians is restricted. Where crossing or reverse-flow movements exist, the probability of conflicts is high and its avoidance requires changes of speeds and position. The LOS provides reasonable fluid flow; however considerable friction and interactions between pedestrians are likely to occur.
E	49 - 75	Virtually, all pedestrians would have their normal walking speeds restricted. At the lower range of this LOS, forward movement is possible only by shuffling. Space is insufficient to pass over slower pedestrians. Cross- and reverse-movement are possible only with extreme difficulties. Design volumes approach the limit of walking capacity with resulting stoppages and interruptions to flow.
F	> 75	Walking speeds are severely restricted. Forward progress is made only by shuffling. There are frequent and unavoidable conflicts with other pedestrians. Cross- and reverse-movements are virtually impossible. Flow is sporadic and unstable. Space is more characteristics of queued pedestrians than of moving pedestrian streams.

- Ka Wai Man Road public housing development (Site 9) is the site with the largest population size of the Land Use Proposal on the western part of Kennedy Town. Pedestrians walking along the footpath of Ka Wai Man Road will be dispersed to the footpaths of adjacent roads, such as Victoria Road, which is similar to or even wider than that of Ka Wai Man Road. Due to the dispersion effect, the LOS of the footpath of Ka Wai Man Road is considered to be the most critical within the Land Use Proposal on the western part of Kennedy Town. As mentioned in Para. 3.1 of the Traffic Review, the walking environment of Ka Wai Man Road after the population intake of the public housing development would be acceptable.

Supplement to paragraph 4.2 (Rationale for determining the provision of goods vehicle and private car parking spaces for public uses)

- As mentioned in Para. 4.2 of the Traffic Review, about 50 goods vehicles and 70 private car parking spaces dedicated for public use will be provided at the

underground car park at Site 3a, and 25 light goods vehicles parking spaces will be provided at the Ka Wai Man Road public housing development at Site 9.

Good vehicles

- It is observed that the demand of goods vehicles parking spaces on Hong Kong Island will be decreasing in the long run¹. Taking into account the latest goods vehicle parking spaces currently available around Kennedy Town area and the potential reduction due to the termination of some short term tenancy parking sites in the future², we propose to provide about 50 parking spaces for goods vehicles at Site 3a and 25 parking spaces for light goods vehicles at Site 9.

Private cars

- Provision of parking spaces should be compatible with Government's overall transport policy. As a general principle, parking should be provided at a level which will not unduly attract potential passengers to use private vehicles in preference to public transport. The internal parking and loading/unloading facilities of new development sites should be self-contained and be provided within the site according to the requirements as stipulated in the Table 11 of Chapter 8 of Hong Kong Planning Standards and Guidelines (HKPSG). We constantly monitor the supply and demand situation of parking spaces of the territory. From time to time, we review the demand of parking spaces of various development types and update the parking standards in the HKPSG accordingly. Considering the above principle, and with due regard of the existing situation of illegal parking during mid-night at the Western District, about 70 parking spaces for private cars were suggested to be provided at Site 3a for public use in addition to the requirements stipulated in the HKPSG.

Supplement to section 6 (Public transport services for serving the new developments)

- The Transport Department will plan, at an appropriate time before the completion of the new developments, the use of public transport services including franchised bus and green minibuses (GMB) services for the new developments taking into account different factors including the changes of population and passenger demand, public views and result from service level

¹ Upon completion of the developments of the western part of Kennedy Town, it was estimated that the demand of parking spaces for goods vehicles in the Central and Western District would be less than 380.

² Upon completion of the developments of the western part of Kennedy Town, the parking spaces available in the Central & Western District would be about 310.

investigation in order to meet the public need. This is to ensure the coordination between these public transport services and to promote the effective use of the resources of the public transport, as well as to minimize traffic congestion and roadside air pollution.




DIAGRAM 4.3.A.1: FLOWS AND NOTATION

DIAGRAM 4.3.A.2: MAJOR ROAD WIDTH W AND ITS COMPONENTS







Diagram (a) Lane width measurements for the right-turning minor road stream





2.4 Signal Calculations

2.4.1 Signal Calculation Concepts

- 2.4.1.1 The amount of traffic that can pass through a signal-controlled intersection from a given approach i.e. the capacity, will depend on the green time available to the traffic and the maximum flow of vehicles pass the stopline during the green period.
- 2.4.1.2 The discharge of vehicles from a queue may be illustrated by Diagram 2.4.1.1. When the green period commences, vehicles take some time to start and to accelerate to normal running speed, but after a few seconds, the queue discharges at a more or less constant rate which is termed the 'saturation flow'.
- 2.4.1.3 The saturation flow may be defined as the maximum flow which can be obtained if there is a continuous queue of vehicles and they were given 100 percent green time.
- 2.4.1.4 For the convenience of signal calculation, the green and amber periods are replaced by an 'effective green' period (g), throughout which flow is assumed to take place at the saturation rate, and a 'lost' time (l) during which no flow takes place.

If k = combined green and amber period
 g = effective green period
 G = actual green time
 l = lost time for a single phase
 S = Saturation flow
 C = Cycle time

Then capacity Q from an approach may be expressed as



2.4.2 Estimation of Saturation Flow

2.4.2.1 Exclusive Straight-ahead Lanes

TRRL RR 67 (Ref. 20) suggested that :-

- (i) The saturation flow per lane (S) expressed in terms of passenger car units per hour (pcu/h), with no turning traffic may be given by
 $S = 1940 + 100(W - 3.25)$ for nearside lane or single lane entries
 $S = 2080 + 100(W - 3.25)$ for non-nearside lanes
 Where W is the lane width at entry in metres.
- (ii) The total saturation flow may be taken as the sum of the individual lane values.
- (iii) Signal approaches are sometimes locally widened to provide an additional lane near the junction.

When the additional lane at the stopline is available for a distance back from the stopline at least sufficient to contain one full cycle capacity of traffic, the above methods of estimation of saturation flow apply. If the signal approach is only widened very close to the stopline, then the above formulae may be a considerable overestimate capacity. A more realistic approach capacity should be deduced from entry lanes before widening plus an allowance for extra vehicles stored every cycle in the additional lane provided near the intersection. In these circumstances, on sit estimation of saturation flow will be necessary.

Reference may be made to Table 2.2.3.2 in Section 2.2.3.5 for general guidance on marking of lanes at approaches.

2.4.2.2 Effect of Gradients

- (i) For each 1 per cent of uphill gradient the saturation flow (S) should be decreased by 42 pcu/h. The gradient should be taken on the average slope between the stopline and a point on the approach 60m before it.
- (ii) Downhill gradients have no effect on the saturation flow.

2.4.2.3 Effect of Composition

The effect of different types of vehicle on the saturation flow at traffic signals is given by the following p.c.u. equivalents :-

2.4.2.5 Lanes with Mixed Traffic

$$S_M = S/(1+1.5f/r) \quad \text{for unopposing turning traffic}$$

$$S_M = (S-230)/(1+1.5f/r) \quad \text{for opposed turning traffic}$$

where f = proportion of turning vehicles in a lane.

2.4.2.6 Effect of Waiting Vehicles & Bus Stops

- (i) Reduction in saturation flow caused by parked vehicles in the vicinity of the approach is equivalent to a loss of carriageway width at the stopline as follows :-
loss in c/w width = $1.68 - \frac{0.9(z-7.62)}{G}$ (metres)
where z (≥ 7.62) is the clear distance of the nearest parked vehicle from the stopline in metres.
 G is green time in seconds.
If the whole expression becomes negative the effective loss should be taken to be zero. The effective loss may be increased by 50 per cent for a parked medium or heavy goods vehicle.
- (ii) No stopping restriction before and beyond a junction may be considered where junction capacity is tight or where the parking/stopping activities are adversely affecting the effective operation of the junction signals.
- (iii) The actual effects of a stopping bus are complex and will vary considerably depending on bus stop location, bus dwell time, parking activity, lane configuration and traffic volume. Until further research is accomplished, it is recommended that a p.c.u. value of 5.0 may be taken for stopping buses that operate and stop within 200 m of the signals.

Designers should also refer to Section 2.4 of T.P.D.M. Vol. 9 for detailed guidelines on siting of bus stops.

2.4.3 Measurement of Saturation Flows

- 2.4.3.1 It is not always practicable to conduct direct measurements of saturation flows e.g. because of resources constraints or when designing new intersections. Direct measurements are however definitely worthwhile for critical intersections working near saturation as the direct measurements will provide more accurate flows for detailed signal plan preparation or junction capacity analysis.
- 2.4.3.2 Formal measurements of saturation flow shall be conducted in accordance with U.K. Road Note No. 34.
- 2.4.3.3 Less formal measurements may be made for approaches where there are existing signals or where the junction is police controlled. It is usually satisfactory to carry out such counts commencing, say, 5 seconds after the traffic has started so as to eliminate starting delays and continuing the count until traffic begins to "tail off". A reasonably consistent value of saturation flow could usually be obtained after several counts.

2.4.4 Total Lost Time per Cycle (L)

2.4.4.1 With 2 sec red/amber (starting amber)

3 sec amber (leaving amber)

$I = 5 + R$ (see diag. 2.3.2.1)

where R = all red period

I = intergreen period

If lost time for a single phase in the green and amber period (Z) = 2 sec

loss time per phase change = $(I - 3) + z$

Total lost time per cycle

$L = (I - 1)$

or = $(R + 4)$

2.4.4.2 For a full pedestrian stage during which all traffic is stopped, the pedestrian green and flashing green periods should be considered as additional all red periods (i.e. additional lost times) in signal calculations.

2.4.5 **Flow Factors**

2.4.5.1 Flow factor 'y' for each phase is given by

$$y = \frac{\text{design flow for an approach (q)}}{\text{saturation flow for an approach (S)}}$$

2.4.5.2 Where more than one approach is operating during a phase the maximum 'y' should be used. Where an early cut-off or late start is to be used in connection with a right turn the 'y' values for the right turn and for the approach with shortened time should be added together to represent one phase unless the straight on traffic on the same approach as the right turn has a higher value, when this latter figure should be taken.

2.4.5.3 The summation of these higher y values for the phases is the 'Y' value which is in fact a measure of the congestion and which will be used for calculating the optimum signal setting.

$$Y = \sum y$$

2.4.6 **Cycle Times (C_o , C_m and C_p)**

2.4.6.1 For an isolated signal installation, where the mean traffic level is constant and where vehicle arrivals are at random, the U.K. Transport and Road Research Laboratory (TRRL) has shown that the optimum cycle time for minimum delay is given by :-

$$C_o = \frac{1.5L + 5}{1 - Y} \text{ secs}$$

2.4.6.2 Also and the cycle time which is just sufficient to pass the traffic is given by :-

$$C_m = \frac{L}{1 - Y}$$

2.4.6.3 This is the minimum possible cycle time which may be associated with excessively long delays. In designing linked signals a cycle time should be chosen which provides a margin over this minimum possible cycle time for the key intersection. In practice it will be generally appropriate to choose a practical cycle time, such that the installation is then loaded to 90 per cent of its capacity

$$C_p = \frac{0.9L}{0.9 - Y}$$

2.4.6.4 In locations where pedestrian crossing volumes are high it will be desirable to use as short a cycle time as practicable to minimize delays imposed on pedestrians. It will be of good practice to limit cycle times to below 90 seconds and where this is not intended due to capacity reasons, careful checking of site conditions should be made to ensure that pedestrians are not being endangered. In designing for new junctions the maximum operating cycle time should be limited to 90 seconds.

2.4.7 Green Times

2.4.7.1 Signal setting for the effective green periods(g) should be in proportion to the y values on each approach, with an allowance for lost time

$$\frac{g_1}{g_2} = \frac{y_1}{y_2} \text{ etc.} \quad \text{where } g = \text{effective green period} \\ y = \text{flow facto}$$

$$\text{and } g = \frac{y(c - L)}{Y} \quad G = \text{actual green period}$$

$$G = g - l \quad c = \text{cycle time}$$

$$\text{i.e. } g_1 = \frac{y_1(c - L)}{Y} \quad L = \text{total lost time}$$

Y = summation of flow factors

$$g_2 = \frac{y_2(c - L)}{Y} \text{ etc.}$$

c - L = total effective green time
time

2.4.7.2 Care should be taken in performing the calculation if parallel pedestrian facilities are included in the junction method of control. If they are included, the minimum green times for the minor movements could well be dictated by parallel pedestrian crossing green times. This could well considerably distort the green split calculation.

2.4.8 Degree of Saturation

2.4.8.1 Degree of saturation (X) for individual approaches may also be expressed as :-

$$X = \frac{q}{Q}$$

where q = design flow
Q = capacity of approach
c = cycle time
S = saturation flow

2.4.8.2 The degree of saturation should be the same for all the predominant arms of an intersection when the signal timings are optimum and is given by

$$X_o = \frac{2Y}{1+Y}$$

2.4.9 Junction capacity Analysis

2.4.9.1 The ultimate capacity of an intersection may be defined as the maximum flow which can pass through the intersection with the same relative flows on the various approaches and with the existing proportions of turning traffic.

2.4.9.2 Generally capacity will increase as the cycle time increases, since the ratio of lost time to useful time decreases (the effect becomes negligible when the cycle is very long). In practice, for maximum reserve capacity assessment, a maximum cycle time of 120 seconds should be adopted. However it should be noted that for new installations, the maximum operating cycle time should be limited to 90 seconds (See 2.4.6)

2.4.9.3 If the capacity were taken as the flow which could just be accommodated by such a cycle the delays would normally be excessively high. A practical

capacity of 90 per cent of this maximum possible flow, which produces generally acceptable delays, is recommended.

2.4.9.4 To calculate reserve capacity at 120 sec cycle time

The cycle time which is just long enough to pass all the traffic, is given by

$$C_m = \frac{L}{1 - Y}$$

Similarly the maximum Y which could be accommodated by a fixed cycle time c is given by

$$Y_{\max} = 1 - \frac{L}{c}$$

For $c_m = 120$ sec

For practical purposes, the ultimate Y value, Y_{ult} , is taken as 90 per cent of Y_{\max} .

2.4.9.5 To calculate Reserve Capacity at any cycle time c, R.C.(c)

- (i) Sometimes it may be of interest to know the reserve capacity of a junction operating in the current cycle time i.e. R.C.(c) if c = current cycle time

$$Y_{\max} = 1 - \frac{L}{c}$$

and assuming a practical Y value of 0.9 Y_{\max}

$$R.C.(c) = \frac{0.9Y_{\max} - Y}{Y} \times 100\%$$

- (ii) Care should be taken in performing this calculation if parallel pedestrian facilities are included in the method of control. For minor movements particularly, the minimum green time for the approach can well be dictated by the parallel pedestrian crossing green times. This could well considerably distort the R.C. calculation.

**Overall Landscape Consideration for the Land Use Review
on the Western Part of Kennedy Town
(Extracted from MPC Paper)**

(D) Landscape Considerations

6.15 There are approximately 820 existing trees within the review area. Approximately 200 existing trees are found in the Cadogan Street Temporary Garden (Site 3a) and approximately 520 existing trees are found in the natural and man-made slopes in Site 9. Other existing trees are scattered along the roadside and within existing sitting-out and open space areas. Most of the trees are common tree species such as *Broussonetia papyrifera*, *Celtis sinensis*, *Ficus microcarpa* and *Macaranga tanarius*. Those existing trees within existing open space areas are generally in fair to good condition, whereas those on natural and man-made slopes are generally in poor to fair condition. Two OVTs listed in the Register of Old and Valuable Trees are located within the Kennedy Town Bus Terminus Sitting-out Area along Victoria Road. Two *Artocarpus hypargyrea* which are listed in Agriculture, Fisheries and Conservation Department (AFCD)'s Rare and Precious Plants of Hong Kong are also identified in Site 9.

Sites 1a, 1b and 2

- (a) With reference to the aerial photo dated 1.1.2015, there are no significant resources within the sites and adverse landscape impact due to the proposed development is not anticipated. The future layout design for Sites 1a and 1b should allow for a continuous public access along the promenade.
- (b) Sites 1b and 2 predominately fall within the area subject to ground decontamination works. Landscape mitigation measures under the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) approved in April 2015 include landscape planting along screen hoarding during the decontamination works, and compensatory tree planting with a minimum ratio of 1:1 in terms of quantity upon completion of the works.

Sites 3a and 3b

- (c) While there are relatively fewer trees in Site 3b, the Cadogan Street Temporary Garden has an overall high amenity value. However it is subject to ground decontamination works. With reference to the

landscape assessment within the EIA for the ground decontamination works, all 196 existing trees within the sites, including many mature trees, are proposed to be felled as the soil and the tree roots of those trees are contaminated and will be removed in the future ground decontamination works. Major species includes common species such as *Ficus microcarpa*, *Livistona chinensis* and *Terminalia catappa*. Significant adverse landscape impact is anticipated due to ground decontamination works which necessitated the felling of trees. Landscape mitigation measures under the EIA include landscape planting along screen hoarding during the decontamination works, and compensatory tree planting with a minimum ratio of 1:1 in terms of quantity in the future waterfront upon completion of the works.

Sites 4a and 4b

- (d) The CMG's wharf and godowns are currently located within the sites. With reference to aerial photo dated 1.1.2015, there are no significant resources within the area and adverse landscape impact due to the proposed development is not anticipated.

Site 5

- (e) The site is currently used as an open space, therefore the proposal to retain its current use will result in no change in the landscape resources. Approximately 30 existing trees and palms of common species are found along the perimeter of the site. Major species includes *Garcinia subelliptica*, *Phoenix roebelenii* and *Crateva unilocularis* which are generally in good condition. Adverse landscape impact due to the proposed development is not anticipated.

Site 6

- (f) The site is currently used as a sitting-out area. Approximately 27 existing trees of common species are found. Major species includes *Wodyetia bifurcate* and *Hibiscus tiliaceus* which are generally in good condition. The design layout of the proposed salt water pumping station should take into account the existing trees and avoid disturbance to the existing trees as much as possible. Transplantation of existing trees in good condition should be considered where retention is not feasible.

Site 7

- (g) The site is currently occupied by the Kennedy Town Bus Terminus and the adjacent sitting-out area. Approximately 40 existing trees and palms of common species are found in the eastern and southern portion of the site. Major species includes *Delonix regia*, *Celtis sinensis*, and *Bombax ceiba* which are in fair to good condition. There are also two OVTs in the adjacent proposed open space (Site 7a) in which the canopy of the OVTs are extended into Site 7 and may have conflict with the proposed residential development. The layout design of the proposed residential area should take the tree protection zone of the OVTs as an absolute design constraint. A minimum space of 2m should be maintained between the tree canopy and future development to allow future tree growth and minimise impact from construction works. Details of the tree protection zone of the two OVTs are discussed below.

Site 7a

- (h) The site is currently used as vehicular and pedestrian access to the Kennedy Town Bus Terminus. Approximately five existing trees of common species including two OVTs are found within the site. Major species includes *Ficus microcarpa*, *Ficus variegata* and *Celtis sinensis* which are in good condition. There are two OVTs located at a higher level to the south of the existing bus terminus. Both OVTs are of the species *Ficus microcarpa* and have a DBH (i.e. Trunk diameter measured at 1.3m above ground level) of 1600mm or above. The OVTs, including the retaining structure which the trees are growing on, should be preserved and maintained. The layout design of the proposed open space and the adjacent proposed residential area should avoid disturbance to the tree protection zone of the OVTs. The tree protection zone of the each OVT encompasses the body of the tree and 2m above the tree crown as well as the vertical and horizontal surfaces of the retaining structure/wall/rock surface covered by the tree roots together with the space up to 2m behind those surfaces. Further, a minimum space of 2m should be maintained between the tree canopy and future development to allow future tree growth and minimise impact from construction works. The responsible tree maintenance department shall conduct regular inspections including tree risk assessment and monitor the condition of the OVTs. The Tree Management Office of the Greening, Landscape and Tree Management Section of DEVB shall also conduct regular audit inspections to appraise the conditions of the registered trees. Further, existing trees in good

condition should be preserved and incorporated into the design of the proposed open space.

Site 8

- (i) Site 8 is currently occupied by HyD's temporary works area and FEHD's temporary cleansing depot. There are two existing trees in the southern portion of the site. Conflict with the proposed residential development is anticipated. However, significant adverse landscape impact is not anticipated as the trees are of common species, *Macaranga tanarius*.

Site 8a

- (j) The site is currently occupied by two industrial buildings and a residential development. Approximately three trees of common species, *Ficus microcarpa*, are found in the southern edge of the site and generally in fair to good condition. There is no change proposed regarding the current zoning i.e. "R(E)". Significant adverse landscape impact is not anticipated. In future residential developments, existing trees in good condition should be preserved.

Site 9

- (k) The proposed development is separated into Phases 1 and 2. With reference to the preliminary tree survey conducted by HD, there are approximately 70 existing trees in Phase 1. The existing trees are generally in fair condition, and most of the tree species are common native and exotic species in Hong Kong such as *Celtis sinensis*, *Ficus spp* and *Macaranga tanarius*. Landscape impact in Phase 1 would be fully ascertained by the project proponent at detailed design stage. However, with reference to aerial photo dated 1.1.2015, it is observed that a large portion of the site under Phase 1 is formed and hard paved, and significant adverse landscape impact is not anticipated. In comparison, there is a larger area of dense tree cover in the site under Phase 2. With reference to the information provided by CEDD, most of the tree species in the Phase 2 area are common native and exotic species in Hong Kong such as *Broussonetia papyrifera*, *Ficus microcarpa* and *Macaranga tanarius*. There are also two *Artocarpus hypargyrea* which is a rare and precious species. 449 trees were recorded in the tree survey, and 333 trees were proposed to be felled. Approximately 45 relatively large trees with tree girth over 1m (320mm DBH), in which five have a DBH over 1m, are

identified within the site. Significant landscape impact is anticipated and it is recommended to retain existing trees and mature trees in good condition as many as possible, especially the two *Artocarpus hypargyrea*. Tree planting should be maximized to mitigate landscape impact, especially near the proposed "GB" zone.

The Proposed "GB" Zone Near Site 9

- (l) A large area originally zoned as "U" along Victoria Road, at the south and east sides of the proposed public housing site (Site 9), is proposed to be zoned as "GB". The proposed "GB" zone is densely vegetated at present with approximately 400 existing trees and the proposed zoning can reinforce the protection of existing landscape resources.

Reprovisioning Site of VPM

- (m) With reference to the preliminary tree survey conducted by ArchSD, it is noted that approximately 90 existing trees out of approximately 100 existing trees are proposed to be felled at the reprovisioned site of the VPM due to conflict with the proposed building. All of the trees are common species such as *Ficus microcarpa*, *Macaranga tanarius*, and *Leuceana leucocephala*. Adverse landscape impact is anticipated at the reprovisioning site. Tree planting and greening should be maximized to mitigate landscape impact on the site.

- 6.16 AFCD has no adverse comment on the proposed developments in respect of tree aspect. In the detailed design stage, relevant departments will minimise the development impact on existing trees and provide appropriate landscape measures and feasible tree preservation and compensatory planting proposals in accordance with DEVB's relevant Technical Circular and Lands Department's Land Administration Office Practice Note. For private developments, relevant tree preservation clause and the requirement of Master Landscape Plan will be incorporated in the land sale conditions to minimise the impact arising from tree felling and to require necessary greening measures to mitigate the impact.



Summary of the Conceptual Layout and Themes for the Harbourfront for the Western Part of Kennedy Town

1. The Land Use Review on the Western Part of Kennedy Town aims to provide a broad land use framework as a basis for proposing zoning amendments to the Kennedy Town and Mount Davis Outline Zoning Plan to the Town Planning Board for consideration. Regarding the waterfront area, taking into account the planning and design intention to create a vibrant, attractive and accessible waterfront for the enjoyment of the public, as well as the comments raised by the Task Force on the Harbourfront Developments on Hong Kong Island of the Harbourfront Commission, a design concept (**Plans 1 to 7**) is prepared to illustrate how the planning and design intent of that area could be realised. This could serve as an urban design framework to provide further guidance to the project proponents to develop their individual schemes upon implementation.

2. The waterfront area could be sub-divided into three main portions and their design concepts are specified below:

3. **Area A – Waterfront Promenade** (Sites 1a, 1b and 2)

- primarily intended for recreational and leisure purposes. Small-scale commercial uses in support of the planning intention would be permitted
- under government ownership
- sub-divided into the pier portion and the park portion

Pier Portion (Plan 2)

- pier function retained and revived for marine access of small boats
- small scale commercial uses in the form of low-rise (one storey) structure for food and beverage in the western end only in order to allow better access and visual permeability to the harbour in the east
- on top of the structure, a viewing deck could be provided for public enjoyment of harbour view

Park Portion (Plan 3)

- primarily for leisure activities in a park setting e.g. jogging, family outing, kids' play area, etc.
- sites for events/weekend markets to add vibrancy and diversity of the waterfront area with small scale commercial uses in the form of

low-rise (one storey) structure for food and beverage

➤ landscaping and greening

- the waterfront promenade could be connected with the inland by a footbridge between the viewing deck and the private residential development cum public transport terminus, public toilet and other Government, institution or community facilities

4. **Area B – Leisure and Tourism** (Sites 4a and 4b)

- primarily for leisure and tourism-related uses. Commercial activities in support of the planning intention would be permitted
- under private ownership and currently occupied by two industrial buildings on the landward site
- Sub-divided into the pier portion and warehouse portion

Pier Portion (Plan 4)

- pier function retained for marine access, particularly for cruises and yachts
- small structures of two storeys for alfresco dining
- ad hoc events/celebrations could be held on pier

Warehouse Portion (Plan 5)

- in view of its marine access and waterfront location, opportunity may be taken to convert the area into leisure and tourism-related uses, e.g. boat club
- upon redevelopment, owner will be required to provide a waterfront promenade connecting Areas A and C

5. **Area C – Sports and Recreation** (Site 5)

- the existing Kennedy Town Temporary Recreation Ground (**Plan 6**)
- a piece of government land currently under the management of Leisure and Cultural Services Department for active recreational purposes
- to be retained as permanent open space for active recreational/sports use

6. Efforts are also made to enhance the connectivity and accessibility of the waterfront area through the following measures, subject to detailed design (**Plan 7**):

- at the eastern end of the Review area, the western pavement along Cadogan

Street leading to the waterfront to be widened and crossings on Cadogan Street to be improved to facilitate access of pedestrians from the developed areas to the east and enhance the pedestrian environment;

- a set of footbridges to connect the Ka Wai Man Road area to the south through the proposed private housing development (Site 3a) with the viewing deck and waterfront area direct;
- to the west of the footbridges, an at-grade pedestrian crossing at the junction of Victoria Road and Sai Ning Street to connect the waterfront area through the pavement along the western side of the proposed primary school;
- to the further west, a footbridge to connect the proposed public housing site (Site 9) in the hinterland where the major population in the western Kennedy Town is located and the proposed open space at Site 7a. An at-grade pedestrian crossing could be provided at Sai Ning Street to facilitate onward pedestrian accessibility to the waterfront;
- at the western end, an existing at-grade pedestrian connection via Victoria Road and staircases to connect the proposed public housing site (Site 9) to the waterfront;
- there are 2 existing and 1 proposed at-grade crossings connecting the waterfront area to the developed area to the east; and
- within the waterfront area, a continuous waterfront promenade is proposed from the eastern to western ends, i.e. from Cadogan Street all the way to the Kennedy Town Temporary Recreation Ground (Area C) to link up the new open space network for public enjoyment.
