

**APPLICATION FOR PERMISSION**  
**UNDER SECTION 16 OF THE TOWN PLANNING ORDINANCE**

**1. The Proposal**

- 1.1 The applicant seeks planning permission for temporary open storage of construction materials and machineries and associated filling of land for a period of three years at the application site (the Site), which falls within an area zoned “AGR” on the OZP (**Plan A-1**). According to the covering Notes of the OZP, temporary use or development of any land not exceeding a period of three years requires planning permission from the Town Planning Board (the Board). Filling of land in the “AGR” zone also requires planning permission from the Board. The Site is currently hard-paved, largely fenced-off, erected with some temporary structures and partly used for the applied use without valid planning permission (**Plans A-2 and A-4**).
- 1.2 The Site is accessible from Mei Fung Road via local tracks (**Plans A-1 to A-3**). According to the applicant, the applied use involves a total area of about 827m<sup>2</sup> (about 65.1% of the Site) for open storage of construction materials (such as rebar, bricks, tiles) and machineries (such as elevated platforms, digging machines and generators) with a maximum stacking height of 3m (**Drawing A-1**). The applicant also applies for regularisation of filling of land for the entire Site with concrete of not more than 0.2m in depth (to a site level of about 10.1mPD) for site formation and vehicular circulation (**Drawing A-2**). Peripheral fencing of about 2.5m in height will be erected along the site boundary on all sides. No structure will be erected, and no storage of dangerous goods, dismantling, maintenance, repairing, cleansing, paint spraying or other workshop activities will

be carried out on the Site at all times. One parking space for private car and one loading/unloading space for light goods vehicle (LGV) are provided at the Site. The operation hours are between 9:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. from Mondays to Saturdays, with no operation on Sundays and public holidays. Plans showing the site layout and land filling area submitted by the applicant are on **Drawings A-1** and **A-2** respectively.

1.3 In support of the application, the applicant has submitted the following documents:

- (a) Application Form with attachments received on 3.3.2026 (**Appendix I**) and 6.3.2026
- (b) Further Information (FI) received on 5.5.2026\* (**Appendix Ia**)
- (c) FI received on 17.6.2026\* (**Appendix Ib**)

*\* accepted and exempted from publication and recounting requirements*

1.4 On 17.4.2026, the Rural and New Town Planning Committee (the Committee) of the Board agreed to defer making a decision on the application for two months as requested by the applicant.

## **2. Justifications from the Applicant**

The justifications put forth by the applicant in support of the application are detailed in the Application Form and FIs at **Appendices I** to **Ib**, and can be summarised as follows:

- (a) the applied use can help meet the increasing demand for open storage in the New Territories. The temporary nature of the application would not frustrate the long-term planning intention of the “AGR” zone. The applied use is not incompatible with the surrounding areas and there are similar applications approved in the vicinity;
- (b) LGV will be used for transportation of construction materials and machineries from and to the Site. Sufficient manoeuvring space for vehicles will be provided within the Site, and staff will be deployed at the ingress/egress of the Site to direct traffic; and
- (c) in support of the current application, the applicant has submitted drainage record for the as-built drainage facilities implemented at the Site. Adverse environmental impacts on the surrounding areas are not anticipated.

## **3. Compliance with the ‘Owner’s Consent/Notification’ Requirements**

The applicant is the sole ‘current land owner’ of the Site. Detailed information would be deposited at the meeting for Members’ inspection.

#### **4. Town Planning Board Guidelines**

The Town Planning Board Guidelines for ‘Application for Open Storage and Port Back-up Uses under Section 16 of the Town Planning Ordinance’ (TPB PG-No. 13G) promulgated by the Board on 14.4.2023 are relevant to the application. The Site falls within Category 2 areas under TPB PG-No. 13G, and the relevant extracts of which are at **Appendix II**.

#### **5. Background**

The Site is currently not subject to any active planning enforcement action. Subject to collection of sufficient evidence, appropriate enforcement action under the Town Planning Ordinance would be undertaken.

#### **6. Previous Applications**

The Site is involved in three previous applications (No. A/YL-KTN/745, 771 and 993) for temporary hobby farm, animal boarding establishment and warehouse respectively, which were all approved with conditions by the Committee between 2021 and 2024. Considerations of these applications are not relevant to the current application due to different use involved. Details of the previous applications are summarised at **Appendix III** and their locations are shown on **Plan A-1**.

#### **7. Similar Applications**

There are 19 similar applications for temporary open storage use with filling of land/pond (including five also involving warehouse with/without container storage yard use) within the same “AGR” zone in the vicinity of the Site in the past five years. All these applications were approved with conditions by the Committee between 2023 and 2026 mainly on the considerations that the proposed/applied use on a temporary basis could be tolerated; the proposed/applied use was not incompatible with the surrounding areas; the relevant government departments consulted generally had no adverse comments or their concerns and public comments, if any, could be addressed by approval conditions; and the application was generally in line with TPB PG-No. 13G. Details of the similar applications are summarised at **Appendix III** and their locations are shown on **Plan A-1**.

#### **8. The Site and Its Surrounding Areas (Plans A-1 to A-4)**

8.1 The Site is:

- (a) currently hard-paved, largely fenced-off, erected with some temporary structures and partly used for the applied use without valid planning permission; and
- (b) accessible from Mei Fung Road via local tracks.

8.2 The surrounding areas are rural in character with an intermix of open storage/storage yards/warehouses (including three sites with valid planning permissions), animal boarding establishment, scattered residential structures, farmland, grassland and vacant land.

## **9. Planning Intention**

9.1 The planning intention of the “AGR” zone is primarily to retain and safeguard good quality agricultural land/farm/fish ponds for agricultural purposes. It is also intended to retain fallow arable land with good potential for rehabilitation for cultivation and other agricultural purposes.

9.2 According to the Explanatory Statement of the OZP for the “AGR” zone, as filling of land may cause adverse drainage and environmental impacts on the adjacent areas, permission from the Board is required for such activities.

## **10. Comments from Relevant Government Departments**

10.1 Apart from the government department as set out in paragraph 10.2 below, other departments consulted have no objection to or no adverse comment on the application. Their general comments on the application and advisory comments in the Recommended Advisory Clauses, if any, are provided at **Appendices IV** and **V** respectively.

10.2 The following government department does not support the application:

### **Agriculture and Nature Conservation**

Comments of the Director of Agriculture, Fisheries and Conservation (DAFC):

- (a) does not support the application from agricultural perspective as the Site possesses potential for agricultural rehabilitation;
- (b) the Site falls within the “AGR” zone. The agricultural activities are active in the vicinity, and the agricultural infrastructures such as road access and water source are also available. The Site can be used for agricultural activities such as open-field cultivation, greenhouses, plant nurseries, etc.; and
- (c) no comment on the application from nature conservation perspective.

## **11. Public Comment Received During Statutory Publication Period**

On 10.3.2026, the application was published for public inspection. During the statutory public inspection period, one public comment was received from an individual objecting to the application mainly on the grounds that there would be potential fire safety impact; and previous revocations were involved at the Site (**Appendix VI**).

## **12. Planning Considerations and Assessments**

- 12.1 The application is for temporary open storage of construction materials and machineries and associated filling of land for a period of three years at the Site zoned “AGR” (**Plan A-1**). Whilst the applied use is not in line with the planning intention of the “AGR” zone and DAFC does not support the application from agricultural perspective, taking into account the planning assessments below, there is no objection to the applied use with associated filling of land on a temporary basis of three years.
- 12.2 Filling of land in the “AGR” zone requires planning permission from the Board as it may cause adverse drainage and environmental impacts on the adjacent areas. In this regard, the Chief Engineer/Mainland North of Drainage Services Department and Director of Environmental Protection have no objection to the application from drainage and environmental perspectives respectively. As the Site is zoned “AGR”, an approval condition requiring the reinstatement of the Site upon expiry of the planning permission so as to uphold the planning intention of the “AGR” zone and restore the greenery of the area is recommended should the Committee decide to approve the application.
- 12.3 The applied use is considered not incompatible with the surrounding areas which are rural in character with an intermix of open storage/storage yards/warehouses, animal boarding establishment, scattered residential structures, farmland, grassland and vacant land. The Chief Town Planner/Urban Design and Landscape of Planning Department (PlanD) has no adverse comment on the application and considers that the applied use is not incompatible with the landscape setting in the proximity and significant adverse landscape impact arising from the applied use is not anticipated.
- 12.4 The Site falls within Category 2 areas under TPB PG-No. 13G. The application is considered generally in line with TPB PG-No. 13G in that, except DAFC, other relevant government departments consulted, including the Commissioner for Transport and Director of Fire Services, have no objection to or no adverse comment on the application. To address the technical requirements of concerned departments, appropriate approval conditions are recommended in paragraph 13.2 below. It is also recommended to advise the applicant to follow the revised ‘Code of Practice on Handling the Environmental Aspects of Temporary Uses and Open Storage Sites’ to minimise any potential nuisance caused by the applied use should the Committee decide to approve the application.
- 12.5 There are 19 approved similar applications for temporary open storage with associated filling of land/pond within the same “AGR” zone in the vicinity of the Site in the past five years as mentioned in paragraph 7 above. Approving the current application is in line with the Committee’s previous decisions.
- 12.6 Regarding the public comment as mentioned in paragraph 11, the departmental comments and planning assessments above are relevant.

### 13. Planning Department's Views

- 13.1 Based on the assessments made in paragraph 12 and having taken into account the public comment mentioned in paragraph 11 above, PlanD has no objection to the application.
- 13.2 Should the Committee decide to approve the application, it is suggested that the permission shall be valid on a temporary basis for a period of three years until 26.6.2029. The following conditions of approval and advisory clauses are also suggested for Members' reference:

#### Approval conditions

- (a) the submission of a revised record of the existing drainage facilities within **3** months from the date of planning approval to the satisfaction of the Director of Drainage Services or of the Town Planning Board by 26.9.2026;
- (b) the existing drainage facilities shall be maintained at all times during the planning approval period;
- (c) the compliance with fire safety requirements within **9** months from the date of planning approval to the satisfaction of the Director of Fire Services or of the Town Planning Board by 26.3.2027;
- (d) if the above planning condition (b) is not complied with during the planning approval period, the approval hereby given shall cease to have effect and shall be revoked immediately without further notice;
- (e) if any of the above planning condition (a) or (c) is not complied with by the specified date, the approval hereby given shall cease to have effect and shall on the same date be revoked without further notice; and
- (f) upon expiry of the planning permission, the reinstatement of the site, including the removal of hard paving and fill materials and grassing of the site to the satisfaction of the Director of Planning or of the Town Planning Board.

#### Advisory clauses

The recommended advisory clauses are at **Appendix V**.

- 13.3 Alternatively, should the Committee decide to reject the application, the following reason for rejection is suggested for Members' reference:

the applied use with associated filling of land is not in line with the planning intention of the "AGR" zone which is primarily to retain and safeguard good quality agricultural land/farm/fish ponds for agricultural purposes, and to retain fallow arable land with good potential for rehabilitation for cultivation and other agricultural purposes. There is no strong planning justification in the submission for a departure from the planning intention, even on a temporary basis.

#### **14. Decision Sought**

- 14.1 The Committee is invited to consider the application and decide whether to grant or refuse to grant permission.
- 14.2 Should the Committee decide to approve the application, Members are invited to consider the approval condition(s) and advisory clause(s), if any, to be attached to the permission, and the period of which the permission should be valid on a temporary basis.
- 14.3 Alternatively, should the Committee decide to reject the application, Members are invited to advise what reason(s) for rejection should be given to the applicant.
