1. The Proposal

- 1.1 The applicant seeks planning permission for proposed temporary warehouse (excluding dangerous goods godown) with ancillary facilities for a period of 3 years and filling of land at the application site (the Site), which falls within an area zoned "AGR" on the Kam Tin North OZP (Plan A-1). According to the covering Notes of the OZP, temporary use of land not exceeding a period of 3 years requires planning permission from the Town Planning Board (the Board). Filling of land within the "AGR" zone also requires planning permission from the Board. The Site is largely vacant, fenced, partly paved and occupied by a container and some vehicles (Plans A-2 and A-4).
- 1.2 According to the applicant, the proposed temporary warehouse is for storage of miscellaneous goods such as packaged food, apparel, footwear, electronic goods and furniture, etc.. The proposed development involves erection of two single-storey structures with a total floor area of about 435m² and building heights of about 8.23m for warehouse, site office and washroom uses (**Drawing A-1**). The applicant also applies for filling of land for the whole site with concrete by not more than 0.2m in depth (from +11.1mPD/+11.2mPD to +11.2mPD/+11.3mPD), of which 260m²/46% has been filled for 0.1m, for site formation and circulation. A maximum of 4 staff members will be stationed at the Site to support the warehouse operation. The operation hours will be between 9:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. from

Mondays to Saturdays with no operation on Sundays and public holidays. No workshop, recycling, cleansing, dismantling and other workshop activities will be carried out at the Site. A loading/unloading space for light goods vehicle will be provided at the Site. The Site is accessible from Mei Fung Road via a local access (**Plans A-1** and **A-2**). The site layout plan and paving plan submitted by the applicant are at **Drawings A-1** and **A-2**.

- 1.3 In support of the application, the applicant has submitted the following documents:
 - (a) Application form with supplementary information received (**Appendix I**) on 30.6.2023
 - (b) Further Information (FI) received on 21.8.2023* (Appendix Ia)

2. Justifications from the Applicant

The justifications put forth by the applicant in support of the application are detailed in the application form, supplementary information and FI at **Appendices I** and **Ia**. They can be summarised as follows:

- (a) The proposed development is temporary in nature and will not frustrate the long-term planning intention of the "AGR" zone. The proposed development is not incompatible with the surrounding environment.
- (b) There are similar applications approved by the Rural and New Town Planning Committee (the Committee) in the vicinity of the Site within the same "AGR" zone.
- (c) The filling of land of 0.2m in depth is necessary for site formation and circulation purposes and has been kept minimal to meet the operational needs of the proposed development. The Site will be reinstated upon expiry of the planning approval.
- (d) The applicant will strictly follow the 'Code of Practice on Handling the Environmental Aspects of Temporary Uses and Open Storage Sites' issued by the Environmental Protection Department (EPD) to minimise adverse environmental impacts and nuisance to the surrounding area and the 'Professional Persons Environmental Consultative Committee Practice Notes' for sewerage treatment. The proposed development will not induce adverse traffic, environmental and drainage impacts to the surrounding areas.

3. Compliance with the "Owner's Consent/Notification" Requirements

The applicant is not the "current land owner" of the Site but has complied with the requirements as set out in the Town Planning Board Guidelines on Satisfying the "Owner's Consent/Notification" Requirements under Sections 12A and 16 of the Town Planning Ordinance (TPB PG-No. 31A) by posting site notice and sending notification letter to the Kam Tin Rural Committee by registered mail. Detailed information would be deposited at the meeting for Members' inspection.

4. Background

The Site is currently not subject to any active planning enforcement case.

5. Previous Application

The Site is involved in a previous application (No. A/YL-KTN/752) for temporary animal boarding establishment which is not relevant to the current application. Details of the previous application are summarised in **Appendix II** and the location is shown on **Plan A-1**.

6. Similar Applications

- 6.1 There are eight similar applications (No. A/YL-KTN/709, 824, 852, 890, 898, 904, 905 and 920) (including renewal of temporary planning approval) for various temporary warehouse uses (seven of which with filling of land) within the same "AGR" zone in the vicinity of the Site in the past 5 years. All the applications were approved with conditions by the Committee between June 2020 and July 2023 mainly on the considerations that temporary approval would not frustrate the long-term planning intention; the development was not incompatible with the surrounding land uses; and relevant departments consulted in general had no adverse comment on the application or their technical concerns could be addressed by relevant approval conditions.
- 6.2 Details of the applications are summarised in **Appendix II** and the locations are shown on **Plan A-1**.
- 6.3 Other than similar applications as stated in paragraph 6.1 above, applications No. A/YL-KTN/938, 939 and 940 for the same use as the current application will be considered at the same meeting.

7. The Site and Its Surrounding Areas (Plans A-1 to A-4)

- 7.1 The Site is:
 - (a) Largely vacant, fenced and occupied by a container and some vehicles; and
 - (b) accessible from Mei Fung Road via a local access.
- 7.2 The surrounding areas have the following characteristics:
 - (a) to its north and east are open storage/storage yards (including one site with valid planning permission for proposed warehouse use under application No. A/YL-KTN/904), residential structures/dwellings, grassland and vacant lands; and

- (b) to its west and northwest are vacant land (with planning permission for proposed animal boarding establishment under application No. A/YL-KTN/815), a watercourse, an animal boarding establishment, grassland, a storage yard and vacant lands; and
- (c) to its south and southwest are open storage yard (with valid planning permission under application No. A/YL-KTN/771 for proposed animal boarding establishment), vacant lands (with valid planning permissions for animal boarding establishment under applications No. A/YL-KTN/769 and 775), holiday camp (with valid planning permission under Application No. A/YL-KTN/868) and a dried pond.

8. Planning Intention

- 8.1 The planning intention of the "AGR" zone is primarily to retain and safeguard good quality agricultural land/farm/fish ponds for agricultural purposes. It is also intended to retain fallow arable land with good potential for rehabilitation for cultivation and other agricultural purposes.
- 8.2 According to the Explanatory Statement of the OZP, as filling of land may cause adverse drainage and environmental impacts on the adjacent areas, permission from the Board is required for such activities.

9. Comments from Relevant Government Departments

- 9.1 Apart from the government department as set out in paragraph 9.2 below, other departments consulted have no objection to or no adverse comment on the application. Their general comments on the application and advisory comments in the Recommended Advisory Clauses are provided in **Appendices III and IV** respectively.
- 9.2 The following government department does not support the application:

Agriculture and Nature Conservation

Comments of the Director of Agriculture, Fisheries and Conservation (DAFC):

- (a) does not support the application from agricultural perspective as the Site possesses potential for agricultural rehabilitation;
- (b) the Site falls within the "AGR" zone and is largely vacant. The agricultural activities are active in the vicinity, and agricultural infrastructures such as road access and water source are also available. The Site can be used for agricultural activities such as open-field cultivation, greenhouses, plant nurseries, etc.; and
- (c) no comment on the application from nature conservation perspective.

10. Public Comment Received During Statutory Publication Period (Appendix V)

The application was published for public inspection. During the statutory public inspection period, a public comment from an individual was received objecting to the application mainly on the grounds that the approval conditions under previous application are not complied with; and brownfield use should be phased out.

11. Planning Considerations and Assessments

- 11.1 The application is for proposed temporary warehouse (excluding dangerous goods godown) with ancillary facilities for a period of 3 years and filling of land at the Site zoned "AGR" (Plan A-1). The planning intention of the "AGR" zone is primarily to retain and safeguard good quality agricultural land/farm/fish ponds for agricultural purposes and to retain fallow arable land with good potential for rehabilitation for cultivation and other agricultural purposes. Whilst the proposed development is not in line with the planning intention of "AGR" zone and DAFC does not support the application from agricultural perspective, taking into account the planning assessments below, the proposed development on a temporary basis of 3 years could be tolerated. Filling of land within the "AGR" zone requires planning permission from the Board as it may cause adverse drainage and environmental impacts on the surrounding areas. In this regard, the Chief Engineer/Mainland North of the Drainage Services Department (CE/MN of DSD) and the Director of Environmental Protection (DEP) have no objection to the application from the drainage and environmental perspectives. An approval condition requiring the reinstatement of the Site to an amenity area is recommended should the Committee decide to approve the application.
- 11.2 The proposed development is considered not incompatible with the surrounding areas which are rural in character predominated by open storage/storage yards, grassland, residential structures/dwellings and vacant land. The Chief Town Planner/Urban Design and Landscape of the Planning Department considers that significant adverse impact arising from the proposed development is not anticipated, and has no objection to the application from landscape planning perspective.
- 11.3 Relevant departments consulted including the Commissioner for Transport, DEP, CE/MN of DSD and the Director of Fire Services have no objection to or no adverse comment on the application. To address the technical requirements of concerned government departments, appropriate approval conditions are recommended in paragraph 12.2 below. The applicant will also be advised to follow the revised "Code of Practice on Handling the Environmental Aspects of Temporary Uses and Open Storage Sites" issued by the Environmental Protection Department (EPD) to minimise any possible environmental nuisance.
- 11.4 There are eight approved similar applications as mentioned in paragraph 6 above. Approval of the current application is in line with the Committee's previous decisions.
- 11.5 Regarding the public comment objecting the application as mentioned in paragraph 10, the departmental comments and planning assessments as stated above are relevant.

12. Planning Department's Views

- 12.1 Based on the assessments made in paragraph 11 and having taken into account the public comment mentioned in paragraph 10, the Planning Department considers that the proposed development <u>could be tolerated</u> for a period of 3 years.
- 12.2 Should the Committee decide to approve the application, it is suggested that the permission shall be valid on a temporary basis for a period of 3 years until 25.8.2026. The following conditions of approval and advisory clauses are also suggested for Members' reference:

Approval conditions

- (a) no operation between 7:00 p.m. and 9:00 a.m., as proposed by the applicant, is allowed on the site during the planning approval period;
- (b) no operation on Sundays and public holidays, as proposed by the applicant, is allowed on the site during the planning approval period;
- (c) no recycling, cleansing, repairing, dismantling work nor other workshop activities, as proposed by the applicant, is allowed on the site at any time during the planning approval period;
- (d) the implementation of the accepted drainage proposal within **6** months from the date of planning approval to the satisfaction of the Director of Drainage Services or of the Town Planning Board by <u>25.2.2024</u>;
- (e) in relation to (d) above, the implemented drainage facilities on the site shall be maintained at all times during the planning approval period;
- (f) the submission of a fire service installations proposal within 6 months from the date of planning approval to the satisfaction of the Director of Fire Services or of the Town Planning Board by 25.2.2024;
- (g) in relation to (f) above, the implementation of the fire service installations proposal within 9 months from the date of planning approval to the satisfaction of the Director of Fire Services or of the Town Planning Board by 25.5.2024;
- (h) if any of the above planning condition (a), (b), (c) or (e) is not complied with during the planning approval period, the approval hereby given shall cease to have effect and shall be revoked immediately without further notice;
- (i) if any of the above planning condition (d), (f) or (g) is not complied with by the specified date, the approval hereby given shall cease to have effect and shall on the same date be revoked without further notice; and
- (j) upon expiry of the planning permission, the reinstatement of the site to an amenity area, as proposed by the applicant, to the satisfaction of the Director of Planning or of the Town Planning Board.

Advisory clauses

The recommended advisory clauses are at **Appendix IV**.

12.3 Alternatively, should the Committee decide to reject the application, the following reason for rejection is suggested for Members' reference:

the proposed development is not in line with the planning intention of the "AGR" zone which is primarily to retain and safeguard good quality agricultural land/farm/fish ponds for agricultural purposes. It is also intended to retain fallow arable land with good potential for rehabilitation for cultivation and other agricultural purposes. There is no strong planning justification given in the submission for a departure from the planning intention, even on a temporary basis.

13. Decision Sought

- 13.1 The Committee is invited to consider the application and decide whether to grant or refuse to grant permission.
- 13.2 Should the Committee decide to approve the application, Members are invited to consider the approval condition(s) and advisory clause(s), if any, to be attached to the permission, and the period of which the permission should be valid on a temporary basis.
- 13.3 Alternatively, should the Committee decide to reject the application, Members are invited to advise what reason(s) for rejection should be given to the applicant.
