1. The Proposal

- 1.1 The applicant seeks renewal of planning approval for temporary public vehicle park (private cars and light goods vehicles) for a period of 3 years at the application Site (the Site) zoned "V" on the OZP (**Plan A-1a**). According to the Notes of the OZP for "V" zone, 'public vehicle park (excluding container vehicle)' is a Column 2 use which requires planning permission from the Town Planning Board (the Board). The Site is currently occupied by the applied use with a valid planning permission until 10.7.2023 (**Plans A-2 to A-4**).
- According to the applicant, the Site is accessible via a paved vehicular track connecting Tsui Sing Road (**Drawing A-1** and **Plan A-2**). No medium goods vehicle, heavy goods vehicle and container trailer/tractor will be allowed to enter the Site. No vehicles without valid licences issued under the Road Traffic Ordinance are allowed to be parked at the Site. The operation hours are from 7:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m. from Mondays to Sundays, including public holidays. The site plan, location plan with vehicular access, layout plan, landscape and tree preservation plan, as-built drainage plan and fire service installations (FSIs) proposal are at **Drawings A-1 to A-5** respectively.

- 1.3 The Site is involved in six previous applications (No. A/YL-PS/258, 310, 395, 498, 543 and 606) for temporary public vehicle park uses (**Plan A-1b**). The last application No. A/YL-PS/606 for temporary public vehicle park (private cars and light goods vehicles) for a period of 3 years was approved by the Rural and New Town Planning Committee (the Committee) on 10.7.2020 (Details at paragraph 6 and at **Appendix III** below).
- 1.4 Compared with the last application No. A/YL-PS/606 for temporary public vehicle park (private cars and light goods vehicles), the current application is submitted by the same applicant for the same use at the same site with the same development parameters and layout.
- 1.5 In support of the application, the applicant has submitted the following documents:

2. Justifications from the Applicant

The justifications put forth by the applicant in support of the application are detailed at **Appendices I**. They can be summarised as follows:

- (a) The proposed development is in line with the planning intention of the "V" zone which is primarily for the convenience of the villagers. There is an insufficient supply to meet exigent parking demand in Sheung Cheung Wai.
- (b) The proposed development is compatible with the surrounding environment. Similar planning applications have been approved by the Board in the nearby "V" zone. There would be minimal traffic impact, insignificant noise and environmental impact.
- (c) All approval conditions of the last application No. A/YL-PS/606 has been complied with.

3. <u>Compliance with the "Owner's Consent/Notification" Requirements</u>

The applicant is not a "current landowner" but has complied with the requirements as set out in the Town Planning Board Guidelines on Satisfying the "Owner's Consent/Notification" Requirements under Sections 12A and 16 of the Town Planning Ordinance (TPB PG-No. 31A) by posting site notice and sending notice to the Ping Shan Rural Committee by registered post. Detailed information would be deposited at the meeting for Members' inspection.

4. Town Planning Board Guidelines

The Town Planning Board Guidelines on Renewal of Planning Approval and Extension of Time for Compliance with Planning Conditions for Temporary Use or Development (TPB PG-No.34D) are relevant to this application. The relevant assessment criteria are at **Appendix II**.

5. Background

The Site is not subject to planning enforcement action.

6. Previous Applications

6.1 The Site is involved in six previous applications (No. A/YL-PS/258, 310, 395, 498, 543 and 606) for temporary public vehicle park (private cars and light goods vehicles). Details of the previous applications were summarised at **Appendix III** and their locations are shown on **Plan A-1b**.

Approved applications

6.2 Applications No. A/YL-PS/258, 310, 395, 498, 543 and 606 for temporary public vehicles park for private cars and light goods vehicles for a period of three years and their renewals were all approved with conditions by the Committee between 2009 to 2020 mainly on the considerations that the development would not frustrate the long-term planning intention of the "V" zone, the development was not incompatible with the surrounding land uses, and the development would unlikely generate significant adverse environment, traffic, drainage and landscape impacts on the surrounding areas. However, application No. A/YL-PS/498 was revoked on 6.8.2016 due to non-compliance with approval conditions on implementation of fire service installations proposal, submission and implementation of landscape and tree preservation proposal, and the provision of boundary fencing. For the last approved application No. A/YL-PS/606, all the time-limited approval conditions have been complied with and the planning permission is valid until 10.7.2023.

Rejected application

6.3 Application No. A/YL-PS/258 for proposed temporary public vehicle park for private car, light goods vehicle and medium goods vehicle for a period of 3 years was rejected by the Committee on 15.12.2006 for the reasons of not compatible with the adjacent residential structures, insufficient information to demonstrate no adverse environmental, traffic, drainage and landscape impacts on the surroundings and undesirable precedent.

7. Similar Applications

There are 17 similar applications for temporary public vehicle park within the same "V" zone in the past five years. All were approved by the Committee in 2018 and 2023 respectively on similar considerations that the applied use would not jeopardise the long-term development of the sites; and no objection to or no adverse comment from

government departments. Amongst these approved applications, applications No. A/YL-PS/561 and 592 were subsequently revoked due to non-compliance with approval conditions. Details of the application are summarised at **Appendix IV** and their locations are shown on **Plan A-1a**.

8. The Site and Its Surrounding Areas (Plan A-1a to Plan A-4)

8.1 The Site is:

- (a) currently occupied by the applied use with valid planning permission under application No. A/YL-PS/606 (**Plan A-1b and A-2**); and
- (b) accessible to Tsui Sing Road via the nearby vehicle parks to its west and northwest (Plan A-2).
- 8.2 The surrounding areas have the following characteristics (**Plan A-2**):
 - (a) to the immediate north and northeast are residential dwellings, bee farm and orchard. To the further north is a temporary public vehicle park with valid planning permission under application No. A/YL-PS/635;
 - (b) to the east is vacant and unused land;
 - (c) to the immediate south is Sheung Cheung Wai which dominated by residential dwellings. To the further south and southeast are a temporary public vehicle park with valid planning permission under application No. A/YL-PS/630; and
 - (d) to the west and northwest are a temporary public vehicle parks with valid planning permission under applications No. A/YL-PS/657, intermixed with residential dwellings and land working in progress.

9 Planning Intentions

The planning intention of "V" zone is to reflect existing recognized and other villages, and to provide land considered suitable for village expansion and reprovisioning of village houses affected by Government projects. Land within this zone is primarily intended for development of Small House (SH) by indigenous villagers. It is also intended to concentrate village type development within this zone for a more orderly development pattern, efficient use of land and provision of infrastructures and services. Selected commercial and community uses serving the needs of the villagers and in support of the village development are always permitted on the ground floor of a New Territories Exempted House. Other commercial, community and recreational uses may be permitted on application to the Board.

10 Comments from Relevant Government Departments

10.1 Apart from the government department as set out in paragraph 10.2 below, other departments consulted have no objection to or no adverse comment on the

application. Their general comments and advisory comments in the Recommended Advisory Clauses are provided in $Appendices\ V$ and VI respectively.

10.2 The following government department supports the application:

Traffic

- 10.2.1 Comments of the Commissioner for Transport (C for T):
 - (a) she supports the application from traffic engineering perspective to meet the public demand on car parking spaces; and
 - (b) the applicant should note her advisory comments in **Appendix VI.**

11 Public Comments Received During Statutory Publication Periods

On 9.5.2023, the application was published for public inspection. During the statutory public inspection period, no public comment was received.

12 Planning Considerations and Assessments

- 12.1 The application is for renewal of planning approval for temporary public vehicle park (private car and light goods vehicle) for a period of three years at the Site zoned "V" on the OZP. Whilst the development is not entirely in line with the planning intention of the "V" zone, it could serve the local villagers/residents for meeting their car parking needs. In this regard, C for T supports the application. Moreover, the District Lands Officer/Yuen Long, Lands Department advises that there is no SH application approved or under processing at the Site. As such, approval of the application on a temporary basis for a period of three years would not jeopardise the long-term planning intention of the "V" zone.
- 12.2 The surrounding areas comprise predominately residential dwellings, vacant land and same brownfield operations (**Plan A-2**). The applied use is considered generally not incompatible with the surrounding land uses.
- 12.3 The application complies with TPB PG-No. 34D in that there is no material change in planning circumstances since the granting of the previous approval under application No. A/YL-PS/606; adverse planning implications arising from the renewal of the planning approval are not envisaged; all the time-limited conditions under previous approval have been complied with; and the three-year approval period sought is the same as the previous approval and is considered reasonable.
- 12.4 Other relevant government departments, including the Director of Environmental Protection, Chief Engineer/Mainland North, Drainage Services Department, Director of Fire Services and Chief Town Planner, Urban Design and Landscape Section, Planning Department have no objection to or no adverse comment on the application. The applied use will unlikely create significant adverse traffic, environmental, drainage and landscape impacts on the surrounding areas.

- Should the planning application be approved, the applicant will also be advised to follow the latest "Code of Practice on Handing the Environmental Aspects of Temporary Uses and Open Storage Sites".
- 12.5 Given that six previous applications for similar uses at the Site and 17 similar applications were approved by the Committee (**Plans A-1a and A-1b**), approval of the current application is in line with the Committee's previous decisions.
- 12.6 There is no public comment received during the statutory publication period.

13 Planning Department's Views

- 13.1 Based on the assessments made in paragraph 12 above, the Planning Department the Planning Department has <u>no objection</u> to the applied use for a further period of three years.
- 13.2 Should the Committee decide to approve the application, it is suggested that the renewal shall be valid on a temporary basis for a period of three years, and be renewed from 10.7.2023 until 9.7.2026. The following conditions of approval and advisory clauses are also suggested for Members' reference:

Approval conditions

- (a) the submission of a condition record of the existing drainage facilities within 3 months to the satisfaction of the Director of Drainage Services or of the Town Planning Board by 10.10.2023;
- (b) in relation to (a) above, the implemented drainage facilities on the Site shall be maintained at all times during the planning approval period;
- (c) the existing fire service installations implemented on the Site shall be maintained in efficient working order at all times during the planning approval period;
- (d) if any the above planning conditions (b) and (c) is not complied with during the planning approval period, the approval hereby given shall cease to have effect and shall be revoked immediately without further notice; and
- (e) if the above planning conditions (a) is not complied with by the specified date, the approval hereby given shall cease to have effect and shall on the same date be revoked without further notice.

[Approval conditions (a) and (b) are the same as those under the permission for application No. A/YL-PS/606; restrictions on operation hours, vehicle types, specific activities, as well as requirements on maintenance of fencing, have been removed as per the department's latest requirements; and restrictions on queuing are now stipulated as advisory clauses according to latest comments from the Commissioner for Transport.]

Advisory Clauses

The recommended advisory clauses are attached at **Appendix VI**.

13.3 Alternatively, should the Committee decide to reject the application, the following reason for rejection is suggested for Members' reference:

the planning intention of "V" zone is primarily intended for development of SH by indigenous villagers. The development is not in line with the planning intention of the "V" zone. No strong planning justification has been given in the submission for a departure from the planning intention, even on a temporary basis.

14 <u>Decision Sought</u>

- 14.1 The Committee is invited to consider the application and decide whether to grant or refuse to grant permission.
- 12.1 Should the Committee decide to approve the application, Members are invited to consider the approval condition(s) and advisory clause(s), if any, to be attached to the permission, and the period of which the permission should be valid on a temporary basis.
- 14.2 Alternatively, should the Committee decide to reject the application, Members are invited to advise what reasons for rejection should be given to the applicant.
